


Major Related Legislation

House Bill No. 1494 provides that the district court may appoint the Board of University and School Lands as trustee for abandoned minerals, the board may charge and deduct from earnings a reasonable fee for the services provided, and all bonuses, rental payments, and royalties paid to the board under this provision must be deposited in the common schools trust fund.

House Concurrent Resolution No. 3037 amends Sections 1 and 2 of Article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota relating to distributions from and management of the common schools trust fund and the trust funds of other educational or charitable institutions.

Section 8 of Senate Bill No. 2013 provides a continuing appropriation from the lands and minerals trust fund to pay the principal and interest to the common schools trust fund on any loans made from the fund to the developmentally disabled facility loan fund Nos. 2 and 3. Previously this appropriation was contained in the bill providing the appropriation for the Department of Human Services.
