



## **Major Related Legislation**

House Bill No. 1177 allows the Historical Society to deposit its unexpended appropriations in the historical impact emergency fund up to an amount of \$250,000.

Senate Bill No. 2023 authorizes the Industrial Commission, acting as the North Dakota Building Authority, to issue bonds for capital projects, including the Chateau de Mores Interpretive Center renovation and expansion (total project cost of \$1.6 million) and the Heritage Center research collections expansion (total project cost of \$5.7 million).

Senate Bill No. 2207 provides that the Historical Society may develop and administer a historical marker program for the purpose of identifying local, state, and national points of interest in the state.
