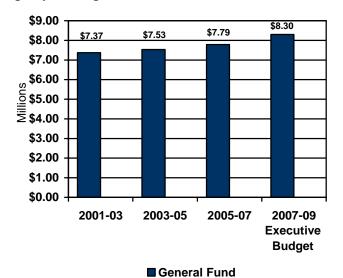
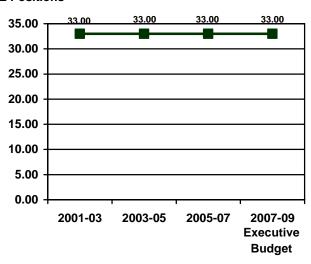

Continuing Appropriations

Legislative services fund - NDCC Section 54-35-19 - Used for depositing and spending funds relating to legislative information services.

Related Legislation

House Bill No. 1028 - This bill requires the Legislative Council to create a 12-member energy development and transmission interim committee.

House Bill No. 1106 - This bill increases legislators' session pay by \$15 per day, from \$125 to \$140 per day, and interim meeting pay by \$25 per day, from \$100 to \$125 per day.

House Bill No. 1107 - This bill increases the state mileage reimbursement rate from 37.5 to 45 cents per mile.

House Bill No. 1156 - This bill continues the Legislative Council's six-member interim Workers' Compensation Review Committee that was scheduled to be discontinued on July 31, 2007.

House Bill No. 1175 - This bill allows legislators and legislators-elect to receive per diem and expense reimbursement for attending the biennial meeting of the Legislative Council held in each even-numbered year.

House Bill No. 1399 - This bill appropriates \$10,000 from the general fund to the Legislative Council for paying the state's annual membership fees for participation in the Multistate Highway Transportation Agreement.

House Bill No. 1404 - This bill appropriates \$450,000, of which \$200,000 is from the general fund, to the Legislative Council for a Medicaid study.

Senate Bill No. 2010 - This bill, the Insurance Commissioner's appropriation bill, appropriates \$60,000 from the insurance regulatory trust fund to the Legislative Council for legislative members to attend functions of the National Conference of Insurance Legislators.

Senate Bill No. 2246 - This bill increases the state meal reimbursement rate from \$25 to \$28 per day and the state lodging reimbursement rate from \$50 per night plus tax to \$55 per night plus tax.
