



#### Other Sections in Bill

**Transfer authority** - Section 11 provides that the State Board of Higher Education may transfer funds from an institution's operations line item to the institution's capital assets line item if the board determines that additional funds are needed for capital projects or extraordinary repairs. Section 12 provides that the State Board of Higher Education may transfer funds from an institution's deferred maintenance line item to the institution's capital assets line item or may transfer funds from an institution's capital assets line item or may transfer funds from an institution's capital assets line item or may transfer funds from an institution's capital assets line item to the deferred maintenance line item.

**Security and emergency preparedness transfers** - Section 13 provides that \$4 million of the North Dakota University System office security and emergency preparedness line item be used for the benefit of institutions under its control.

FTE positions - Section 14 authorizes the State Board of Higher Education to adjust FTE positions as needed for institutions and entities under its control.

**Bonding authorization** - Section 16 authorizes the State Board of Higher Education to issue revenue bonds for the West Dining Center renovation (\$7,000,000) and the Niskanen Apartments (\$20,000,000).

#### **Continuing Appropriations**

**Special revenue funds** - North Dakota Century Code (NDCC) Section 15-10-12 - Provides the continuing appropriation authority for higher education institutions' special revenue funds, including tuition, through June 30, 2009. Senate Bill No. 2038 (2009) would continue the continuing appropriation authority through June 30, 2011. See **Major Related Legislation** for more information.

### Major Related Legislation

Senate Bill No. 2038 - This bill continues through June 30, 2011, the continuing appropriation of higher education institutions' special revenue funds and through July 31, 2011, the authority for the North Dakota University System to continue at the end of the biennium unspent general fund appropriations and the requirement that the budget request and appropriation of the North Dakota University System include block grants for a base funding component, an initiative funding component, and an asset funding component. The bill provides for a Legislative Council study of higher education and provides performance and accountability measures to be included in the State Board of Higher Education performance and accountability report pursuant to NDCC Section 15-10-14.2.
