Other Sections in Bill

Appropriation - Transfer - Section 2 provides for a one-time transfer of \$25,000 from the general fund to the Secretary of State's election fund for the imputed interest earnings allocable to the amount of nonfederal funds contained in the fund.

Secretary of State's salary - Section 3 provides the statutory changes increasing the Secretary of State's salary. The Secretary of State's annual salary is increased from the current level of \$79,571 to \$83,550, effective July 1, 2009, and to \$87,728, effective July 1, 2010, to reflect the 5 percent and 5 percent recommended salary increase.

Secretary of State's election fund - Section 4 amends NDCC Section 16.1-01-15 to provide that any interest earnings on the election fund must be used for the exclusive purpose of carrying out activities of the Help America Vote Act of 2002.
