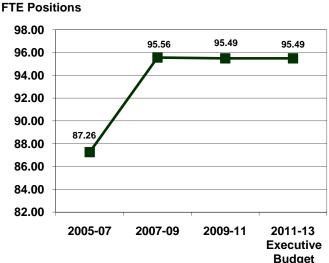

Other Sections in Bill

Additional income appropriation - Section 3 provides that in addition to the amount appropriated as other funds any other income from federal acts, private grants, gifts, and donations, or from other sources received by the branch research centers, is appropriated for the purposes designated in the act, grant, gift, or donation for the 2009-11 biennium.

Transfer authority - Section 4 authorizes the transfer of appropriation authority between the Main Research Center, the branch research centers, NDSU Extension Service, and Northern Crops Institute and provides that any transfers be reported to OMB.

FTE position adjustments - Section 5 authorizes the State Board of Higher Education to adjust or increase FTE positions for the branch research centers and provides that any adjustments be reported to OMB.

Unexpended general fund - Excess income - Section 6 authorizes the continuation of any unexpended general fund appropriation and excess income received by the branch research centers into the 2013-15 biennium.

Branch research center renovations - Section 7 continues any unspent selected funding from Subdivision 4, Section 1, of Chapter 48 of the 2009 Session laws. This includes money from the general fund for the Main Research Center's appropriation for renovations and additions to the North Central Research Center (\$624,000), the Williston Research Center (\$1,680,000), the Langdon Research Center (\$144,000), and the Dickinson Research Center (\$489,200).

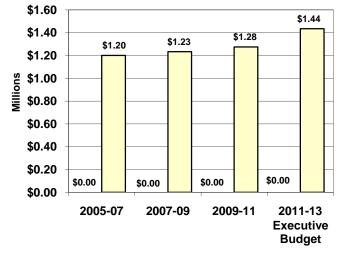

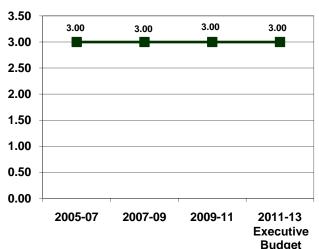
