FIRST DAY

Senate Chamber, Bismarck, North Dakota, March 8, 1937.

At the hour of 9:00 o'clock a. m., being the day and hour appointed by the Governor for the convening of the Special Session of the Twenty-fifth Legislative Assembly, pursuant to Proclamation issued by the Governor, the members of the Senate assembled in the Senate Chamber, and were called to order by Lieutenant Governor Thoresen, President of the Senate.

Senator Fine: In spite of the fact that the farmers of this state have for years been honest in trying to feed the people by producing at less than cost of production and at a loss of their homes, and in spite of the fact that approximately one-half of the people of this state are on relief, this legislature hastens to impose a certain, definite consumption or poverty tax on a large part of our people in the form of a sales tax.

In view of these facts this tax on net incomes of individuals

and corporations is by no means high enough. But if this is the limit as to rates and revenue that this legislature is willing to impose on net incomes, I vote "aye", although the rates are too low, based on the fundamental principle underlying fair and just taxation, namely, on the basis of ability to pay.

Senator Stucke: I vote "aye" on this bill for the reason that it is apparently the best we can do. I have consistently voted for an increase in the income tax rate.

Senator Greene: If it is constitutional to tax property in our state, which we are doing by the passage of the sales tax, it should also be constitutional to tax the net incomes of corporations within the state. Therefore I vote "no" on this bill because the rates are too low.

Senator Thorson: I vote "no" on this bill for the reason that there is a better bill coming over from the House.

Senator Williams: One reason I vote "no" on this bill is because of the mistake I made a while ago, that our good friend Brostuen called me on—the tax on railroads and corporations. I saw I had made a mistake and I thought we could remedy that mistake by putting in this amendment of Senator Fine's, raising the tax on corporations from 6% to 7½%.

Senator Mutchler: I am voting "aye" on this measure, not because I think the rates are as high as they should be, but in the interest of harmony and because it seems it is the best we can do, and because I wish as expeditiously as possible to get the work done.

Mr. President: Your Committee on Highways to whom was referred House Bill No. 2, have had the same under consideration and recommend that the same be amended as follows:

All amendments are on the printed bill:

- 1. After the word "Applications" in the title, strike out the period, insert a comma, and add: "providing for the repeal of all conflicting Acts, declaring an emergency, and providing penalties for violation of this Act."
- 2. On page 3 at line 43, after the word "been," insert the words "three times".

Strike out the words "three minor offenses" and insert in lieu thereof "a misdemeanor under this Act or the laws of this state relating to highways".

- 3. On page 7, Section 7, line 2, strike out the words and figures "Seventy-five (75)" and insert in lieu thereof the words and figures "Fifty (50)".
- 4. On page 8, at line 9, strike out the words "seventy-five" and insert the words "fifty" in lieu thereof.

After the word "fee" in line 9, strike out the period and insert the following: "for such two year period."

- 5. On page 9, Section 9, line 3, strike out the language "minor offense" and insert in lieu thereof, "misdemeanor under this Act or the laws of this state relating to highways."
- 6. On page 12, in line 28, strike out the words "minor offenses" and insert in lieu thereof, "misdemeanors for violation of this Act or of any law of this state relating to highways."
- 7. On page 13, in line 6, strike out the word "the" and insert in lieu thereof the word "any".

Strike out the language, "of Burleigh County, North Da-kota".

- 8. On page 13, Section 14, line 4, strike out the word "the" and insert in lieu thereof the word "any," and strike out the words "of Burleigh County".
- 9. On page 14, in Section 15, at line 8, after the word "General", insert the word "Highway"; put a period after the word "Fund" and strike out the language "of the State Treasury".
- 10. In line 1, Section 16, strike out the words "SHERIFFS TO BE," and insert in lieu thereof "COMMISSIONER TO APPOINT". Strike out the following language in Section 16, "The sheriff of each county shall be appointed as local agent," and insert in lieu thereof "The Highway Commissioner shall appoint local agents".
- 11. In Section 17 on page 14, in line 3, strike out the words "the sheriff" and insert in lieu thereof "such local agent".
- 12. After the word "ACT" in line 5 of Section 17, strike out the balance of the Section.

13. On page 15, at line 14, strike out the word "twenty" and insert the word "fifteen" in lieu thereof.

On page 15, line 25, strike out the word "However" and the balance of the Section.

- 14. At line 36, on page 16, insert a new Sub-section (d) as follows:
- "(d) SALARIES, WAGES AND EXPENSES.) All salaries, wages and other expenses of the Division of Highway Safety and Patrol shall be paid by the State Auditor and State Treasurer out of the "Patrol Fund" herein provided, upon vouchers as now required by law for the payment of all state expenses, duly approved by the Commissioner and the Superintendent, and audited and allowed by the State Auditing Board. The salary of the Superintendent of the Division of Highway Safety and Patrol shall not exceed \$2,000 per annum, and the salary of the Assistant Superintendent shall not exceed \$1,800 per annum, the salary of each highway patrolman shall be fixed by the Superintendent at not to exceed \$125 per month, and shall be paid monthly out of the funds in the "Patrol Fund", provided the salary of any appointee as patrolman shall not exceed \$100 per month for the first six months of employment".
 - 15. Add a new sub-section (e) as follows:
- "(e) QUALIFICATIONS OF HIGHWAY PATROL-MEN.) All members of the Division of Highway Safety and Patrol shall not be less than twenty-five nor more than forty-seven years old on the date of their appointment. They shall, before being qualified to appointment, be required to pass such physical examination and such other qualification test as may be determined by the Superintendent, be of good moral character and of temperate habits, have been citizens of the United States and of the State of North Dakota for not less than two years prior to their appointment. For appointment preference shall be given at all times to honorably discharged Veterans and all appointments shall be made without regard to any political party affiliation of the applicant".
 - 16. Add a new sub-section (f) as follows:
- "(f) POLICE AUTHORITY OF THE DIVISION OF HIGHWAY SAFETY AND PATROL.) The Commissioner and such officers and inspectors of the department as he shall designate and all members of the division of highway safety and patrol shall have the power:
- "1. Of peace officers for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this Act and of any other law regulating the operation of vehicles or the use of the highways.
- "2. To make arrests upon view and without warrant for any violation committed in their presence of any of the provisions of this Act or other law regulating the operation of vehicles or the use of the highways.
- "3. At all times to direct all traffic in conformance with law and in the event of a fire or other emergency or to expedite traffic or to insure safety to direct traffic as conditions may require notwithstanding the provisions of law.

- "4. When on duty, upon reasonable belief that any vehicle is being operated in violation of any provisions of this Act or of any other law regulating the operation of vehicles to require the driver thereof to stop and exhibit his driver's license and the registration card issued for the vehicle and submit to an inspection of such vehicle, the registration plates and registration card thereon or to an inspection and test of the equipment of such vehicle.
- "5. To inspect any vehicle of a type required to be registered hereunder in any public garage or repair shop or in any place where such vehicles are held for sale or wrecking, for the purpose of locating stolen vehicles and investigating the title and registration thereof.
- "6. To serve all warrants relating to the enforcement of the laws regulating the operation of vehicles or the use of the highways.
- "7. To investigate traffic accidents and secure testimony of witnesses or of persons involved.
- "8. To investigate reported thefts of motor vehicles, trailers, and semi-trailers.
- "9. That said patrolmen shall be required to inspect all motor vehicles as to compliance with the provisions of law relating to the issuance and possession of motor vehicle licenses and to fully cooperate with the motor vehicle registrar in carrying out all of the laws relating to motor vehicle licenses, and to take over and perform the duties now performed by motor vehicle license inspectors under the Regulatory Department.
- "10. To take applications for driver's licenses without making charge therefor."
 - 17. Add a new sub-section (g) as follows:
- "(g) (a) The commissioner shall issue to each member of the division of highway safety and patrol a badge of authority with the seal of this State in the center thereof, the word 'North Dakota Highway Patrol' encircling said seal and below the designation of the position held by the member to whom issued. Every such badge shall be serial numbered or each member shall otherwise display a distinctive serial number.
- "(b) Neither the commissioner nor any other person shall issue any such badge to any person who is not a duly appointed and acting member of said division.
- "(c) Any person who without authority wears the badge of a member of said division, or a badge of similar design which would tend to deceive anyone, is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- "(d) Any person who impersonates a member of said division or other officer or employees of the department with intent to deceive anyone, or who without authority wears a uniform likely to be confused with the official uniform of any such officer, is guilty of a misdemeanor."
 - 18. Add a new Section 21 as follows:

"Section 21. PENALTIES.) Any person violating any of the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and for first conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or imprisonment for not more than thirty days; for a second and subsequent convictions within one year thereafter by a fine of not more than \$200.00 or by imprisonment for not more than ninety days, or by both such fine or imprisonment."

SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILLS

House Bill No. 2. A Bill for an Act Providing for the Appointment of a Superintendent of Divisions of Highway Safety and Patrol and Patrolmen and Employees; Providing for Operator's and Chauffeur's License and the Fees to Be Paid Therefor and Providing for the Taking of Registration and Operator's and Chauffeur's License Applications; and Declaring an Emergency.

Was read the second time.

Senator Gilbertson moved that House Bill No. 2 be amended as follows:

On page 15 of the printed bill, subsection (b), line 19, after the word "state," insert the following: "It is further provided that no member of the original Highway Patrol appointed under Chapter 148 of the 1935 Session Laws shall be subject to removal except for nonfeasance, misfeasance, or malfeasance in office.

Senator Gilbertson gave his reasons for the amendment and requested that they be printed in the Journal.

If this amendment fails the state Senator Gilbertson: stands to lose approximately \$1,000.00 per man spent in training and equipping this patrolman. The uniform, shoes, boots, etc., which have been purchased for these men would all be unsuitable for a new appointee. Each patrolman appointed under the original act was sent to Saint Paul for training under the Minnesota Highway Patrol. The patrolmen also received training in life saving and first aid under a staff physician of the Red Cross from Chicago. Whenever one of these men is dismissed the State not only loses the actual cash outlay, spent in equipping and training these men, but also loses highly valuable expertly trained patrolmen. When the Highway Patrol bill was passed in 1933, it was the intent of the Legislature that this patrol whose duty it is to protect the lives of the motorists of this State; that this patrol should not be subject to political domination. You will recall the original bill provided that ex-service men should be given preference. This all bears out the intent of the Legislature in protecting the patrol from politics. This is as it should The Highway Patrol should not be a patronage set-up, but should be an efficient and effective patrol protecting the life and limb of our motorists. It has been this in the past; the record of the original Highway Patrol has been an excellent one, having been highly complimented by the National Safety Council and should therefore not be disrupted in any way. We cannot afford to lose the money involved, neither can we afford to lose these trained men. I sincerely hope, gentlemen, that you will vote this amendment into effect.

- 14. At line 36, on page 16, insert a new Sub-section (d) as follows:
- "(d) SALARIES, WAGES AND EXPENSES.) All salaries, wages and other expenses of the Division of Highway Safety and Patrol shall be paid by the State Auditor and State Treasurer out of the "Patrol Fund" herein provided, upon vouchers as now required by law for the payment of all state expenses, duly approved by the Commissioner and the Superintendent, and audited and allowed by the State Auditing Board. The salary of the Superintendent of the Division

of Highway Safety and Patrol shall not exceed \$2,000 per annum, and the salary of the Assistant Superintendent shall not exceed \$1,800 per annum, the salary of each highway patrolman shall be fixed by the Superintendent at not to exceed \$125 per month, and shall be paid monthly out of the funds in the "Patrol Fund", provided the salary of any appointee as patrolman shall not exceed \$100 per month for the first six months of employment".

- 15. Add a new sub-section (e) as follows:
- "(e) QUALIFICATIONS OF HIGHWAY PATROL-MEN.) All members of the Division of Highway Safety and Patrol shall not be less than twenty-five nor more than forty-seven years old on the date of their appointment. They shall, before being qualified to appointment, be required to pass such physical examination and such other qualification test as may be determined by the Superintendent, be of good moral character and of temperate habits, have been citizens of the United States and of the State of North Dakota for not less than two years prior to their appointment. For appointment preference shall be given at all times to honorably discharged Veterans and all appointments shall be made without regard to any political party affiliation of the applicant".
 - 16. Add a new sub-section (f) as follows:
- "(f) POLICE AUTHORITY OF THE DIVISION OF HIGHWAY SAFETY AND PATROL.) The Commissioner and such officers and inspectors of the department as he shall designate and all members of the division of highway safety and patrol shall have the power:
- "1. Of peace officers for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this Act and of any other law regulating the operation of vehicles or the use of the highways.
- "2. To make arrests upon view and without warrant for any violation committed in their presence of any of the provisions of this Act or other law regulating the operation of vehicles or the use of the highways.
- "3. At all times to direct all traffic in conformance with law and in the event of a fire or other emergency or to expedite traffic or to insure safety to direct traffic as conditions may require notwithstanding the provisions of law.
- "4. When on duty, upon reasonable belief that any vehicle is being operated in violation of any provisions of this Act or of any other law regulating the operation of vehicles to require the driver thereof to stop and exhibit his driver's license and the registration card issued for the vehicle and submit to an inspection of such vehicle, the registration plates and registration card thereon or to an inspection and test of the equipment of such vehicle.
- "5. To inspect any vehicle of a type required to be registered hereunder in any public garage or repair shop or in any place where such vehicles are held for sale or wrecking, for the purpose of locating stolen vehicles and investigating the title and registration thereof.

- "6. To serve all warrants relating to the enforcement of the laws regulating the operation of vehicles or the use of the highways.
- "7. To investigate traffic accidents and secure testimony of witnesses or of persons involved.
- "8. To investigate reported thefts of motor vehicles, trailers, and semi-trailers.
- "9. That said patrolmen, shall be required to inspect all motor vehicles as to compliance with the provisions of law relating to the issuance and possession of motor vehicle licenses and to fully cooperate with the motor vehicle registrar in carrying out all of the laws relating to motor vehicle licenses, and to take over and perform the duties now performed by motor vehicle license inspectors under the Regulatory Department.
- "10. To take applications for driver's licenses without making charge therefor."
 - 17. Add a new sub-section (g) as follows:
- "(g) (a) The commissioner shall issue to each member of the division of highway safety and patrol a badge or authority with the seal of this State in the center thereof, the word 'North Dakota Highway Patrol' encircling said seal and below the designation of the position held by the member to whom issued. Every such badge shall be serial numbered or each member shall otherwise display a distinctive serial number.
- "(b) Neither the commissioner nor any other person shall issue any such badge to any person who is not a duly appointed and acting member of said division.
