If Senate Bill 2380 is enacted the state General Fund revenues would increase by an estimated \$3,241,892 during the 1975-77 Biennium. The federal income tax limitation would increase individual income tax collections by \$117,079 and corporate income tax collections by \$3,124,813. These estimates are based on current levels of collection.

Distribution of Revenue

> 5% Share	37.9% of the funds would be distributed to 1% or 4 of the counties.
> 3% Share	51.6% of the funds would be distributed to 15% or 8 of the counties.
> 2% Share	61.6% of the funds would be distributed to 23% or 12 of the counties.
> 1% Share	87.4% of the funds would be distributed to 60% or 32 of the counties.

There would be \$9.78 in revenue shared per person in the 1975-1977 biennium.

Persons who were in the armed forces and quartered on military installations were enumerated as residents of the counties in which their installations were located. Members of their families were enumerated where they actually resided.

College students were considered residents of the communities in which they were residing when attending college.

Inmates of institutions, who ordinarily live in the institutions for long periods of time, were counted as inhabitants of the place in which the institution was located.

URBAN POPULATION

The urban population comprises all persons living in (a) places of 2,500 inhabitants or more incorporated as cities, boroughs (except in Alaska), villages, and towns (except in the New England States, New York, and Wisconsin), but excluding persons living in rural portions of extended cities (i.e., cities whose boundaries have been extended to include sizable portions of territory that is rural in character, such as city-county consolidations); (b) unincorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more; and (c) other territory, incorporated or unincorporated, included in urbanized areas (a central city, or cities and surrounding closely settled territory).

RURAL NONFARM POPULATION

The population not classified as urban constitutes the rural population. The rural population is subdivided into the rural-farm population, which comprises all rural residents living on farms, and the rural-nonfarm population, which comprises the remainder.

FARM POPULATION

As in the 1960 census, the farm population consists of persons living in rural areas on places of 10 or more acres from which sales of farm products amounted to \$50 or more in the preceding calendar year or on places of less than 10 acres from which sales of farm products amounted to \$250 or more in the preceding year.
