This appropriation is reduced \$30,200 in accordance with estimates for dues for the associations that the Governor's office will participate in.

State Auditor

The salaries and wages line item is reduced \$82,706 to delete funds for the noncontributory retirement plan. The operating expense line item is reduced \$7,208 in accordance with legislative guidelines of nine percent per year regarding inflation.

State Treasurer

The salaries and wages line item is reduced \$14,885 to delete funds for the noncontributory retirement plan. The operating expense line item is reduced a total of \$2,800 by subtracting \$2,500 for microfilming expenses and \$300 for moving expenses.

State Tax Commissioner

The salaries and wages line item is reduced \$167,756 to delete funds for the noncontributory retirement plan. The salaries and wages line item is increased \$73,502 for two additional oil and gas tax auditors.

The operating expense line item is reduced \$37,465 in accordance with legislative guidelines of nine percent per year regarding inflation. This line item is increased \$44,150 for the two additional tax auditors.

The equipment line item is increased by \$1,854 for two tax auditors.

Insurance Commissioner

The salaries and wages line item is reduced \$78,740 to delete \$28,392 for the noncontributory retirement plan, and to delete \$50,348 for a public information specialist position. The operating expense line item is reduced \$1,071 in accordance with legislative guidelines of nine percent per year regarding inflation.

Labor Commissioner

The salaries and wages line item is reduced \$11,234 to delete funds for the noncontributory retirement plan.

Public_Service Commission

The salaries and wages line item is reduced \$106,135 to delete funds for the noncontributory retirement plan. The operating expense line item is reduced \$12,203 in accordance with legislative guidelines of nine percent per year regarding inflation. SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 57-38 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby created and enacted to read as follows:

SIMPLIFIED OPTIONAL METHOD OF COMPUTING TAX.

- 1. Notwithstanding the other provisions of this chapter, an individual, estate, or trust may elect to determine state income tax liability by applying the provisions of this Act. Any taxpayer electing to determine his income tax liability pursuant to this Act shall only be eligible for those adjustments or credits which are specifically provided for in this Act.
- 2 A tax is hereby imposed for each taxable year upon income earned or received in that taxable year by every resident and nonresident individual, estate, and trust. This tax shall be seven and one-half percent of the individual's, estate's, or trust's adjusted

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federal income tax liability for the taxable year.

- 3. The adjusted federal income tax liability for a resident individual, estate, and trust shall be determined by multiplying the federal income tax liability by a fraction, the numerator of which is the adjusted gross income taxable to this state and the denominator of which is the total adjusted gross income as reported on the federal income tax return. Interest income from United States obligations and other income not taxable to this state sor state constitutional provisions shall be excluded from the numerator.
- 4. The adjusted federal income tax liability of a nonresident individual, estate, and trust shall be determined by multiplying the federal income tax liability by a fraction, the numerator of which is the adjusted gross income derived from sources within this state and the denominator of which is the total adjusted gross income as reported on the federal income tax return. Interest income from United States obligations and other income not taxable to this state because of federal statutes, United States or state constitutional provisions shall be excluded from the numerator.
- For the purposes of this Act, the term "federal 5 income tax liability" means the individual's, estate's, or trust's federal income tax liability as computed for federal income tax purposes using tax tables or schedule TC, plus additional taxes due on federal income tax additional taxes due on rederal income tax schedules or forms 4970, 4972, 5544, 5405, section 72(m)(5) penalty tax, 4625, 6251, and 5329, and before credit for contributions to candidates for public office, credit for the elderly (schedule R&RP), credit for child and dependent care expenses (form 12441), investment or dit (form 12460) form tay modif (form credit (form 3468), foreign tax credit (form 1116), work incentive credit (form 4874), jobs credit (form 5884), residential energy credit (form 5695), and before reduction for federal income tax withheld, estimated payments, earned income credit, excess Federal Insurance Contributions Act (chapter 21 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended), and the federal Railroad Retirement Tax Act (chapter 22 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended), taxes withheld, credit for federal taxes on special fuels and oils, and regulated investment company credits. The term does not include amounts due for self-employment tax or social security tax and railroad retirement tax on tips.
- 6. Where a husband and wife determine their federal income tax liability for the taxable year on a joint federal income tax return they may elect to determine their North Dakota income taxes separately. The federal income tax liability shall be apportioned between them in the proportion that the adjusted gross income of each bears to their combined adjusted gross income. The adjusted gross income of each shall be determined in the same way that each would have been required to determine it if they had filed separate federal income tax returns.

- 7. a. A resident individual, estate, or 'trust shall be allowed a credit against the tax otherwise due under this Act for the amount of any income tax imposed on the taxpayer for the taxable year by another state or territory of the United States or the District of Columbia on income derived from sources therein and which is also subject to tax under this Act.
 - b. The credit provided under this subsection shall not exceed the proportion of the tax otherwise due under this Act that the amount of the taxpayer's adjusted gross income derived from sources in the other taxing jurisdiction bears to the taxpayer's entire adjusted gross income as reported on the taxpayer's federal income tax return.
- 8. An individual, estate, or trust shall be allowed as a credit against the tax otherwise due under this Act the energy cost relief credit provided for in initiated measure No. 6 as approved by the voters in the November 1980 general election.
- 9. a. Individuals, estates, or trusts receiving a refund of federal income tax for a year for which an election to file state income tax returns has been made under this Act shall file amended state income tax returns reducing the federal income tax liability for the year for which the federal income tax refund is granted and shall not report the federal income tax refund in the year received.

Individuals, estates, or trusts assessed additional federal income tax for a year for which an election to file state income tax returns has been made under this Act shall file amended state income tax returns increasing the federal income tax liability for the year for which the additional federal income tax is assessed and shall not report increased federal income tax liability in the year in which the additional federal income tax is paid.
- 10. The tax commissioner may prescribe procedures and guidelines to prevent requiring income that had been previously taxed under this chapter from becoming taxed again because of the provisions of this section and may prescribe procedures and guidelines to prevent any income from becoming exempt from taxation because of the provisions of this section if it would otherwise have been subject to taxation under the provisions of this chapter.

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. The provisions of this Act shall be effective for all taxable years beginning in 1981 and 1982 only."

Grafton State School

The salaries and wages line item is reduced \$872,909 to delete funds The sataries and wages the item is reduced \$572,855 to delete in for the noncontributory retirement plan. Also, the salaries and wages line item is reduced by \$522,425 to delete funds for the following positions: 1 motor vehicle mechanic, 1 maintenance worker, 53 ward attendant I's for the last six months of the biennium, 4 psychologists, and 2 vocational rehabilitation counselors. Also, the salaries and wages line item is reduced \$330,897 due to extended phasing in of the remaining 195 new positions in this appropriation. It is the intent of the Legislative Assembly that funds for the deleted positions be made available by the next Legislative Assembly for employment of such positions during the 1983-85 biennium to continue efforts to the phase in of additional staff to upgrade programs for the developmentally disabled residents.

The capital improvements line item which includes \$2,934,926 for the remodeling of West and Wylie Halls is reduced by \$1,467,463 since a phasing in of the remodeling of these facilities is recommended during the 1981-83 and 1983-85 bienniums. It is the intent of the Legislative Assembly that these two facilities be remodeled as deinstitutionalization living centers for continuation of the Midway program at the institution. It is intended that the next Legislative Assembly provide funds to complete the remodeling of these facilities into deinstitutionalization living centers. The capital improvements line item is also reduced \$569,625 to delete funds for the central receiving and storage addition.

The estimated income line item is increased by \$5,000 for increased estimates of revenue from sale of meals. It is the intent of the Legislative Assembly that charges to employees for meals eaten at the institution be at least equal to the cost of such meals.

San Haven

The salaries and wages line item is reduced \$312,837 to delete funds for the noncontributory retirement plan. Also, the line item is reduced \$74,137 to allow funds to employ five of the 11 additional nurse positions during the second year of the 1981-83 biennium rather than for the entire biennium. Also, a reduction of \$77,429 is made to delete funds for three of the nine recommended additional program technicians. It is the intent of the Legislative Assembly that the operating appropriation and capital improvements appropriation provides the necessary funds to adequately upgrade the programs for developmentally disabled residents at San Haven.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTE DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. As used in this Act, unless the context otherwise plainly requires:

- 1. "Association" means any club, association, union, brotherhood, fraternity, organization, or group of any kind of two or more persons, including, but not limited to, labor unions, trade associations, professional associations, or governmental associations, which is united for any purpose, business, or object and which assesses any dues, membership fees, or license fees in any amount, or which maintains a treasury fund in any amount. Association shall not include corporations, cooperative corporations, political committees, or political parties.
- "Candidate" means a person whose name is presented for nomination to public office at any primary election or convention, whether the person is

actually nominated or not; a person whose name is printed as a candidate on an official ballot used at any election; or a person who seeks election through write-in votes.

- 3. "Contribution" means a gift of money or property, subscription, loan, advance, or deposit of money, except a loan of money from a bank or other lending institution made in the regular course of business, made for the purpose of influencing the nomination for election, or election, of any person to office. Contribution also means a contract, promise, or agreement, express or implied, whether or not legally enforceable, to make a contribution for any of the above purposes, and includes funds received by a political committee which are transferred to that committee from another political committee or other source.
- "Cooperative corporations" and "corporations" are as defined in the North Dakota Century Code.
- 5. "Expenditure" means a purchase, payment, distribution, loan, advance, deposit, or gift of money or property, except a loan of money from a bank or other lending institution made in the regular course of business, made for the purpose of influencing the nomination for election, or election, of any person to office. Expenditure also means a contract, promise, or agreement, express or implied, whether or not legally enforceable, to make any expenditure and includes the transfer of funds by a political committee to another political committee.
- "Patron" means a person who owns equity interest in the form of stock, shares, or membership, or maintains similar financial rights in a cooperative corporation.
- "Person" means an individual, partnership, committee, association, corporation, cooperative corporation, or other organization or group of persons.

- "Political committee" means any committee, club, association, or other group of persons which receives contributions or makes expenditures for political purposes.
- 9. "Political party" means any association, committee, or organization which nominates a candidate for election to any office which may be filled by a vote of the electors of this state or any of its political subdivisions or legislative districts and whose name appears on the election ballot as the candidate of such association, committee, or organization.
- 10. "Political purpose" or "political purposes" means any activity undertaken in support of or in opposition to the election or nomination of a candidate whether the activity is undertaken by a candidate, a political committee, a political party, or any person. SECTION 2. CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS BY CORPORATIONS, COOPERATIVE CORPORATIONS, AND ASSOCIATIONS PROHIBITED -

VIOLATION - PENALTY.

- No corporation, cooperative corporation, or association shall make a direct contribution:
 - a. To aid any political party, political committee, or organization.
 - To aid any corporation or association organized or maintained for political purposes.
 - c. To aid any candidate for political office or for nomination to such office.
 - d. For any political purpose or the reimbursement or indemnification of any person for money or property so used.
 - e. For the influencing of any measure before the legislative assembly, except in accordance with chapter 54-05.1.
- Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the establishment, administration, and solicitation of contributions to a separate and segregated fund to be utilized for political purposes

by a corporation, cooperative corporation, or association. It shall be unlawful for:

- a. The person or persons controlling such a fund to make contributions or expenditures utilizing money or anything of value secured by physical force, job discrimination, financial reprisals, or the threat of them; or utilizing money from dues, fees, treasury funds, or other money required as a condition of membership in an association, or as a condition of employment; or utilizing money obtained in any commercial transaction. Moneys from fees, dues, treasury funds, or money obtained in a commercial transaction may, however, be used to pay costs of administration of the fund.
- b. Any person soliciting an employee, stockholder, patron, or member for a contribution to such a fund to fail to inform the employee or member of the political purposes of the fund at the time of the solicitation, or of the general political philosophy intended to be advanced through committee activities.
- c. Any person soliciting an employee or member for a contribution to such a fund to fail to inform the employee or member, at the time of the solicitation, of his right to refuse to contribute without any reprisal.
- d. Any contribution to be accepted without keeping an accurate record of the contributor and amount contributed, and of amounts expended for political purposes.
- e. Any contribution to be accepted from any person who is not an employee, stockholder, patron, or member of the corporation, cooperative corporation, or association maintaining the political committee.
- All political committees formed for the purpose of administering the segregated fund provided for herein

shall file a statement listing all contributions receive in excess of one hundred dollars in the aggregate for the calendar year covered by the statement, showing the name and mailing address of each contributor of an amount in excess of one hundred dollars in the aggregate for the calendar year covered by the statement, and a listing of all disbursements made for political purposes, no later than October fifteenth of each calendar year with the office of secretary of state.

- The form of all statements required by this Act shall be as prescribed by the secretary of state.
- b. The secretary of state may arrange an audit of any statement filed pursuant to this Act. The secretary of state shall arrange an audit of any statement that the attorney general requests to be audited. The results of the audit shall be reported to the attorney general.
- c. Records and statements shall be preserved by the secretary of state for a period of four years from the date of filing. The records and statements are public records and shall be open to public inspection.
- 4. No person shall make a payment of his own money or of another person's money to any other person for a political purpose in any name other than that of the person who supplies such money, and no person knowingly shall receive such payment nor enter nor cause the same to be entered in his account or record in any name other than that of the person by whom it actually was furnished.
- 5. If an officer, employee, agent, attorney, or other representative of a corporation, cooperative corporation, or association makes any contribution prohibited by this section out of corporate, cooperative corporation, or association funds or otherwise violates the provisions of this section, it shall be prima facie evidence of a violation by the

corporation, cooperative corporation, or association.

- A violation of the provisions of this section may be prosecuted in the county where the contribution is made, or in any county in which it has been paid or distributed.
- 7. It shall be a class A misdemeanor for an officer, director, stockholder, attorney, agent, or representative of any corporation, cooperative corporation, or association to violate any of the provisions of this section, or to counsel or consent to any violation. Any person who solicits or knowingly receives any contribution in violation of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor.
- 8. Any officer, director, stockholder, attorney, agent, or representative who makes, counsels, or consents to the making of a contribution in violation of this section shall be liable to the company, corporation, or association for the amount so contributed.

SECTION 3. PERSON NOT EXCUSED FROM TESTIFYING AS TO VIOLATION - PROSECUTION OR PENALTY WAIVED UPON TESTIFYING. No person shall be excused from attending and testifying or producing any books, papers, or other documents before any court upon any investigation, proceeding, or trial for a violation of any of the provisions of this Act, upon the ground that the testimony or evidence, documentary or otherwise, required of him may tend to incriminate or degrade him. No person shall be prosecuted nor subjected to any penalty or forfeiture for or on account of any transaction, matter, or thing concerning which he may testify or produce evidence.

SECTION 4. EXPENDITURES FOR OTHER PURPOSES. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prohibit the exercise by corporations, cooperative corporations, and associations of the right to make expenditures and contributions for the purpose of

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promoting passage or defeat of initiated or referred measures, or for promoting any general political philosophy or belief deemed in the best interest of the employees, stockholders, patrons, or members of the corporation, cooperative corporation, or association other than a "political purpose" as defined by this Act.

SECTION 5. REPEAL. Section 16-20-08 of the 1979 Special Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code, 16-20-09 of the 1977 Pocket Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code, and sections 16-20-05, 16-20-10, and 16-20-12 of the North Dakota Century Code are hereby repealed."

This amendment deletes \$39,007 from the Salaries and wages line item of the Division of Independent Study which represents the amount included for a noncontributory retirement program for state employees. 4-18.1-04. MILK STABILIZATION BOARD.

- There is hereby created a milk stabilization 1. board to consist of five members, who shall be appointed by the governor. The board shall consist of one person who is a dairy farmer selling to a processor, who shall be selected by the governor from two names submitted to him by the North Dakota milk producers association; one person who is a processor, who shall be selected by the governor from two names submitted to him by the North Dakota dairy industries association; one person who is a retailer, who shall be selected by the governor from two names submitted to him by the North Dakota association of food retailers; and two persons shall be selected by the governor who are consumers, and who are not otherwise engaged in the milk business. No appointee shall have held elective or appointive public office during the period of two years immediately preceding his appointment and no appointee shall hold any other public office, either elective or appointive, during his term of office as a member of the milk stabilization board; and not more than three members of the said milk stabilization board shall, at the time of the appointment or thereafter during their respective terms of office, be members of the same congressional district.
- 2. The members of said milk stabilization board shall be appointed within thirty days after passage and approval of this chapter. The term of office of one member shall expire on July 1, 1968; the term of office of one member shall expire on July 1, 1969; the term of office of one member shall expire on July 1, 1970; the term of office of one member shall expire on July 1, 1971; the term of office of one member shall expire on July 1, 1972; and each succeeding member shall hold his office for a term of five years and until his successor shall have been appointed and qualified. Any vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the governor as heretofore stated.
- 3. Three members of the board shall constitute a guorum for the regular transaction of business. The board shall choose one of its members as the chairman, who shall hold office as a chairman for one year; provided, election as chairman shall not interfere with the member's right to vote on all matters before the board.
- 4. Each member of the board shall receive twentyfive fifty dollars per diem for each day actually spent in the performance of his official duties, plus mileage and expenses as are allowed to other state officers, but in no event shall a member's per diem payments exceed fifteen hundred dollars in any one year.

- 5. Each member of the board shall give bond conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties in the manner required by law in the sum of five thousand dollars.
- The board shall employ an executive secretary who shall serve under the direction and at the pleasure of the board and whose gualifications, <u>6.</u> and duties, and compensation shall be determined by the board. The executive secretary shall serve as financial officer of the board and shall be authorized to accept money paid to the board in accordance with this chapter. Before entering upon the discharge of his duties, he shall execute and file a bond in an amount as may be fixed by the board or as may be provided by law for public officers.
- 7. The board shall employ, in addition to the executive secretary, such assistants and employees, permanent and temporary, as may be necessary to carry out the duties and responsibilities of the board under the provisions of this chapter. The board shall determine the qualifications, duties and compensation of such employees. The board may employ a licensed attorney of the state of North Dakota as its legal counsel, who shall serve on a full-time or a part-time basis, and the board may obtain the services of such additional attorneys as it deems necessary. The board may also contract for auditing, economic research, and other technical services, whenever it determines that such services are needed.
- 8. All expenditures under this chapter shall be paid from the receipts hereunder. Meetings of the board shall be had held at least every sixty days at the call of the chairman or a majority of the board."

The levy required by this section for repayment must be maintained over the life of the contract with the board, and the school district must have at the time of the loan an existing indebtedness to the maximum limit permitted by law. In determining whether a school district has an existing indebtedness to the maximum limit permitted by law for purposes of this section, the value of taxable property means twice the net value of all taxable property in the school district rather than six times such value as provided in subsection 4 of section 21-03-01.
