STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

Department of Accounts and Purchases

The emergency appropriation for the Department of Accounts and Purchases is increased by \$10,000 to provide for payment of accumulated annual leave for persons who are no longer employed with the department and also to provide adequate funds for salary levels for current employees. The appropriation also is increased by \$8,000 to purchase additional equipment.

Director of Institutions

The appropriation for the Director of Institutions' office is increased by \$22,500 to provide adequate funds for additional expenditures for electricity during the remainder of the 1979-81 biennium. Also, \$3,100 is appropriated for parking lot improvements.

North Dakota State University

This amendment provides for specific legislative designation of the use of additional funds appropriated to North Dakota State University to equip and make functional the music educational building originally authorized in Chapter 87 of the 1979 Session Laws. This amendment also appropriates \$538,077 of private funds available to complete this facility. The Legislative Assembly intends that the music education building be completed, equipped, and made operational without additional requests for general fund appropriations or for appropriations or transfers from any other source of funds or accounts.

School for the Deaf

This amendment provides for the completion of residential facilities at the School for the Deaf.

School for the Blind

The appropriation for the School for the Blind is increased by \$3,000 because of increased estimates for steam heat expenditures.

Health Department

The salaries and wages appropriation is reduced \$100,000 because of additional federal funds made available to the department through its 1979-81 appropriation. The fees and services line item is increased \$19,957 of which \$9,157 is for communications costs and \$10,800 is for miscellaneous expenditures related to moving furniture and equipment into the new state office building. An additional \$5,545 is appropriated for equipment also related to this move.

Grafton State School

The estimated income line item is increased \$164,155 and the general fund appropriation is reduced by the same amount due to revised estimates of estimated income.

San Haven

The line item designation for the San Haven appropriation for "capital improvements" is changed to "acquisition and installation of food service and laundry equipment for the combined services building."

Seed Department

This amendment provides that the emergency appropriation be appropriated from the general fund rather than the Seed Department fund to restore Seed Department funds spent for legal expenses. The state of North Dakota was named in the lawsuit for which the legal expenses were incurred.

Social Service Board

This amendment appropriates \$461,157 to the Social Service Board for additional AFDC payments to be made during the 1979-81 biennium. These payments will be necessary since the Social Service Board is now required to make payments on the 25th of the month rather than the first day of the following month. Thus, the board will incur expenditures for 25 months during the 1979-81 biennium.

Governor's Office

This appropriation provides funds for necessary staffing and expenses for the Governor's office for the remainder of the 1979-81 biennium.


Natural Resources Council

This appropriation provides funds for staffing and expenses for the Natural Resources Council during the remainder of the 1979-81 biennium.

Securities Commissioner

This appropriation provides funds to pay accumulated annual leave amounts to employees leaving office and provides for adequate salaries for commission employees during the remainder of the 1979-81 biennium.


