SECTION 4. NONCONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT PLAN. For the agency named in this Act \$69,161 is included in the salaries and wages line item to fund noncontributory retirement programs. The amount referred to in this section shall not be used for any purpose other than to fund the noncontributory retirement programs for state employees. If the forty-seventh legislative assembly does not provide by statute for a non-

contributory retirement program for state employees, such amount shall remain in the salaries and wages line item until such line item is canceled on July 30, 1983."

#### STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

Salaries and wages of the Board of Higher Education are increased by \$38,946 to provide funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium with funds for fringe benefits including \$69,161 for the state funding of the employees' share of retirement. Operating expenses are reduced by \$13,569 to provide for nine percent inflation increases for each year of the 1981-83 biennium. This amendment also includes \$300,000 for scientific research matching funds at the state universities. Capital improvements for handicapped accessibility are reduced by \$100,000, and tuition assistance is increased by \$200,000 in general fund moneys. A new section is added providing legislative intent on the use of funds for handicapped accessibility projects during the 1981-83 biennium.

- Benefits paid to employees of the state of North Dakota, its departments and instrumentalities, or any instrumentality of more than one of the foregoing, or an instrumentality of the foregoing and one or more other states, which are attributable to employment by an employing unit which, after December 31, 1977, is defined as an employer, shall be financed by one of the following methods:
  - a. By payment of contributions as provided under section 52-04-06, plus one-half the cost of the extended benefits paid that are attributable to wages paid by an employer.
  - b. By payment in lieu of contributions each quarter for the calendar years 1978 and 1979 in an amount equal to one percent of their total quarterly payroll, and the rate of contributions to be paid for each two-year period after 1979 shall be as determined by the bureau each January by computing the cost of benefits paid under chapters 52-06 and 52-07.1 which are attributable to wages paid by employers, and the bureau may modify such rate in order to minimize excess or insufficient payments in any prior periods.
  - c. In lieu of contributions an employer may elect to pay to the bureau for the unemployment fund an amount equal to the amount of benefits paid under chapters 52-06 and 52-07.1 which are attributable to wages paid in the employ of such governmental employer, to individuals for weeks of unemployment.
- 2. Benefits paid to employees of political subdivisions, other than state government, its departments and instrumentalities, or any instrumentality of more than one of the foregoing which are attributable to employment by an employing unit which, after December 31, 1977, is defined as an employer, shall be financed by one of the following methods:
  - a. By payment of contributions as provided under section 52-04-06 plus one-half the cost of the extended benefits paid that are attributable to wages paid by an employer.
  - b. By payment in lieu of contributions each quarter for the calendar year 1978 in an amount equal to one percent of their total quarterly payroll, and the rate of contribution to be paid quarterly each year after 1978 shall be determined by the bureau each January by computing the cost of benefits paid under chapters 52-06 and 52-07.1 which are attributable to wages paid by employers, and the bureau may modify such rate in order to minimize excess or insufficient payments in any prior periods.
  - c. In lieu of contributions an employer may elect to pay to the bureau for the unemployment fund an amount equal to the amount of benefits paid under chapters 52-06 and 52-07.1 which are attributable to wages

POINTS OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

Senator Redlin:

Mr. President, members of the Senate, I am greatly disappointed in the manner in which the appointments to the Arts Council were handled and the less than ideal treatment which was accorded the appointees.

I believe that all appointments made by the executive branch bear consideration as to the qualifications and character of the appointee. There will always be overlaps of appointments whenever there is a change of administration. Each administration will encounter this fact. Our job should be to evaluate fitness of appointees as they come before us.

During the deliberations of our committee, our chairman clearly indicated that he had a message from Governor Olson's office that one particular person was one he wanted. Whereupon our committee proceeded to vote to recommend that the Senate confirm that person and promptly voted against recommending the other four names which had been submitted. The chairman indicated that it was not a question of qualifications, but that is just the way it is.

Due to statutory requirements, the nominees had received a letter of reappointment from the new Governor which served to further confuse these fine people.

The citizens of North Dakota who are notified of executive appointment are entitled to the best use of the advise and consent process.

Senator Lips: Mr. President, I rise on a point of personal privilege. I am sorry about this report. I would like the record to show that I would have voted to confirm Richard Weber from Bismarck. I think he has been an outstanding person on that council, he has done great work in our city, he would have continued to be a good member on the Arts Council.

Senator Redlin: Mr. President, I rise again on a point of personal privilege. I would like the record also to show that the Minority members of this committee supported each and every one of the appointees on every vote.
