REMARKS OF MR. ALLEN ENGEL

Mr. President, Senators: I appreciate very much the welcome you've extended to us here and on behalf of the delegation, I would like to thank you for allowing us to join you here today. All of you have more than lived up to North Dakota's reputation, and you've had it for a long time, of being a friendly state. We came down here at the invitation of Rep. Orlin Hanson and the visit as far as I'm concerned has been very

worthwhile. Coronach, Saskatchewan is in my riding and it's just two miles above the Montana border, and Saskatchewan Power Corporation is building a coal-fired 600 megawatt generating station down there. Through dialogue, then the establishment of an international joint commission and through public hearings, most of the problems in Coronach have been resolved. In fact, just this year an international monitoring committee has been established to monitor the air and the water quality that will be taking place down there at Coronach. I'm sure that today we've laid the groundwork for dialogue to be established between North Dakota and Saskatchewan. The balance of the process will follow in due course and the problems that exist in the Souris Valley can be resolved if we have the proper dialogue rather than get loggerhead so I think the visit today was very worthwhile. We had a good meeting with your president and I've appreciated very much a chance to sit in and see how your House operates. It's quite different than back in Saskatchewan where the government sits on one side and the opposition on the other and the Speaker tries to keep order from the center. Both systems work, and I'm glad that they can work side by side. We appreciate the fact also that we can leave some token to remember us by. Just yesterday we tabled our budget in the province of Saskatchewan. I don't necessarily want to do a lot of bragging about it but it was a balanced budget of over \$2.3 billion. Part of that budget is because of this little token that I want to present to your president here and this is a sample of Saskatchewan potash that gets shipped right down past your state here on the way to Chicago where the biggest part of our markets are. Then, I also want to leave a flag of Saskatchewan. Saskatchewan is depicted on this flag as the green in the north, as far as our northland is concerned, and the gold in the bottom represents our grain so we want to leave this with your president as well and then last year we had a great big birthday party and it was Saskatchewan's 75th year of being part of the Canadian Confederation and I also have a token that I want to leave with him. With that I want to say thank you. It's been great to fellowship with you people and we've enjoyed it very much. Thank you.

POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

Senator Redlin: Mr. President, I rise on a point of personal privilege and request my remarks be printed in the Journal.

Mr. President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate.

In recommending passage of House Bill No. 1455, the Senate Natural Resources Committee requests that this Statement of Legislative Intent be printed in the Senate Journal to clarify new language contained in House Bill No. 1455. The term "<u>augmented seeding</u>" is intended to mean the date on which the permittee completes initial seeding or the date on which the permittee completed supplemental seeding that does not constitute normal conservation practices.

The term "<u>or other work</u>" is intended to mean those activities prescribed by Commission regulation, other than augmented seeding, fertilizing, irrigation, or normal conservation practices, which on the date of completion shall immediately start the ten-year liability period.

The term "<u>surrounding area having equivalent historical management practices</u>" is intended to insure that the productivity and cover standards required of the permittee are based on the actual conditions and use of the disturbed lands immediately prior to mining as compared to lands in the surrounding area that have been subjected to the same or similar management practices that existed on the disturbed lands.

The term "<u>normal conservation practices</u>" is intended to mean those activities that include, but are not limited to, mowing, strip cropping, stubble mulching, shelter belts, pest control, weed control, erosion control, interseeding, and supplementary fertilization.
