Narrative:

With the increase of election workers wages proposed by H.B. 1054 and in reviewing the number of election workers needed for each election in 1984:(1984 primary, 1191 precincts, 6021 workers; 1984 general, 1193 precincts, 6030 workers) the estimated expense for counties to hire election workers for state and county elections in 1986 would be \$360,000 per election. This would be an increase of \$60,000 for each statewide election for election workers wages, or an additional \$120,000 for a biennium. The total expense for election workers wages for both statewide elections would be an estimated \$720,000 rather than \$600,000.

Keep in mind that this bill would effect election expenses for other forms of governmental units in North Dakota as approximately 348 cities and 287 school districts would be required to pay higher wages for election workers when they conduct elections.
