Narrative:

The Workmen's Compensation Bureau now annually stops benefits to approximately 48 dependents of claimants who have attained their 18th birthday. Approximately 10 of these are dependents of deceased claimants, and 38 of these are dependents of disabled claimants. It is assumed that the percentage of eighteen year olds who attend and/or finish college will be the same as the general population, where approximately 70 percent begin college, and 35 percent attain a four-year degree. The additional benefits paid would not be actuarially significant to the Fund.

The cost to the Fund is estimated to be \$26,000 per year at present benefit levels.
