Narrative:

If the Commission does not conduct detailed and regular audits of the indemnity fund assessments from the grain warehousemen, the fiscal impact of this bill would be insignificant.

If the Commission were required to conduct detailed and regular audits, it would require the addition of at least one person to the Commission's grain elevator division, plus the related travel, room and meal expense. The person would not be needed until January 1, 1986. The cost of the position could be funded through a reimbursement by the indemnity fund to the general fund. The estimated cost of the added position is reflected below.
