Narrative:

If passed SB-2235 would seriously impact on criminal record check activity at the state level in the office of the Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI). This office responded to 13,454 criminal record checks by law enforcement agencies during the year 1984. Passage of Bill 2235 is estimated to demand at least another 10,000 record checks and possibly more if other states also request record checks. The BCI now employs two persons to respond to record checks just for law enforcement agencies, and we would have to double that staff to comply with this bill. Even if the record check requests did not double, we would no doubt have to classify and process many additional fingerprint cards which are very time consuming. Additional office supplies and postage would also be required.
