Dear Chairman Lips and Chairman Lodeon:

The legislative intent of SB2436 should be clearly reflected as follows:


1. Passage of SB2436 should not directly or impliedly require the disposal or sale or discontinuance of use of any equipment now owned and operated by the Central Duplicating Department.

2. That the Model 4975 System duplicating equipment presently used was purchased by the Central Duplicating Department with the advice of commercial printers in the area for the purpose of providing efficient in-house duplicating service for the state of North Dakota.

3. That the duplicating equipment presently owned and operated by Central Duplicating Department is considered the most functionally efficient and appropriate equipment for duplicating up to 5,000 single sheets or 25,000 sheets in the aggregate using the full intended capacity of such equipment.

This representation is made on behalf of the printing industry of North Dakota to clarify any questions concerning the legislative intent or the effect of the passage of SB2436.
