Narrative:

The State Department of Health presently administers an underground storage tank program for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The purpose of this legislation is to clarify the Department's authority in regard to hazardous waste management and underground storage tanks. Specifically, the proposed revisions will give the Department the authority to administer a program equivalent to and in lieu of the federal program which includes notice and registration of existing tanks, an inventory control system for tank testing and leak detection, procedures for the closure of tanks, standards of performance and installation for new underground storage tanks, and measures for ensuring evidence of financial responsibility for corrective action in regard to underground storage tanks.

An EPA grant would fund eighty-five percent of the program, with a fifteen percent match by the state. This is the funding formula under the current biennium and this action would not increase current costs or expenditures.
