Narrative:

This bill has no fiscal effect.

The bill deletes a provision of the law related to gaming expenses. This provision is essentially redundant of subsection 3 of section 53-06.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code and therefore, its deletion has no effect. The purpose of this particular part of the bill is to change the statute to accommodate a provision of House Bill 1283 which deletes the description of eligible gaming expenses.

The bill also allows gaming organizations to convert merchandise prizes into cash prizes. This is especially important in a bingo game when two or more players may have won a single merchandise prize to be awarded.
