Narrative:

REVENUE: This bill authorizes gaming organizations to conduct draw poker and stud poker on not more than two occasions per year. The organization would receive ten percent of the pot of each game. This amount would be the organization's adjusted gross proceeds.

Based on statistical information gathered from several casinos and regulatory agencies of states that do allow draw and stud poker, it is estimated that the organizations adjusted gross proceeds from draw and stud poker would approximate \$434,280 for the biennium. The application of the 5% gaming tax on this adjusted gross proceeds would result in \$21,714 of tax being paid in which \$13,028 (60%) would go to the general fund and \$8,686 (40%) would be paid back to the counties and cities.

EXPENSE: An expense of \$25,000 would be incurred to modify the existing gaming computer programs, develop administrative rules and record keeping systems, and train organizations and local law enforcement officials.
