Narrative:

REVENUE: Enables local governing bodies to charge organizations up to \$25 for each local permit. Presently, the charge is \$10 for the 1st local permit and \$25 for the 2nd.

Biennium Fiscal Effect: General Fund 0; Counties/Cities \$12,600.

Eliminates a site permit fee gaming tax credit on the tax return.

Biennium Fiscal Effect: General Fund \$19,000; Counties/Cities \$13,000.

Enables the attorney general to impose monetary fines on gaming organizations, distributors, and manufacturers.

Biennium Fiscal Effect: General Fund \$50,000; Counties/Cities 0.

Enables organizations to charge players playing poker on a time buy-in basis - a fee up to \$2 per half hour of playing time. Presently, the fee is \$10 or 2% rake of each pot.

Biennium Fiscal Effect: General Fund \$750; Counties/Cities \$500.

Reclassifies cash shorts as an expense from, rather than toward, adjusted gross proceeds.

Biennium Fiscal Effect: General Fund \$29,000; Counties/Cities \$19,000.

Enables the attorney general to establish a centralized statewide work permit system and charge each gaming employee an annual fee of \$25 and charge a gaming employee
