Narrative:

This bill would make the private investigative and security "board" an autonomous (independent) board, responsible for licensing and regulating the private investigative and security industry. This industry currently consists of: 37 licensed private investigators, 11 private detective agencies, approximately 50 registered investigators; 19 licensed providers of security, 17 private security agencies, approximately 400 certified security personnel.

Investigators, providers of security, private detective agencies, private security agencies are required to be licensed at a fee of \$100 per individual and \$200 per agency, to expire September 30th of "odd numbered years" (a renewed license is valid for 2 years). There is a \$50 test fee, a one time agency application fee, a one time \$5 fee to certify private security personnel; a \$5 annual armed private security certificate fee.

Estimated expenses consist primarily of staff time necessary to license and regulate persons in the private investigative and security industry (\$8,800), and other related expenses (\$700).
