Narrative:

In developing the fiscal note for HB 1511, the Director of Institutions has only projected the cost of providing changing tables for those rest rooms within the Capitol complex. Every rest room that is primarily meant for the use of the public building belonging to the state should have such facilities available. We are not in a position to determine the number that may exist within the various colleges and universities, the Human Service centers, employment service centers, the Highway Department district offices, or the many other public buildings that belong to the state and are located throughout North Dakota. Therefore, in discussions with Rough Rider Industries, they provided us the two options for meeting the spirit of the bill.

1. Install prefab shelving that would be affixed to the wall in an appropriate location to serve the purpose of a changing area;
2. The actual placement of tables within each of the public bathrooms.

Preliminary figures show the cost would not be significantly different whether we built in a shelf or they provided prebuilt tables.

Enclosed is the cost for two different size tables:

1. Top surface of 16"X30" -- approximately \$100 each.
2. Top surface of 20"X32" -- approximately \$150 each.

Within the buildings located on the Capitol complex, we have 16 public rest rooms. Therefore, if we were going to install the smaller tables, it would cost us approximately \$1,600 for the Capitol complex buildings. If we were to install the larger tables, it would cost approximately \$2,400 to provide a table in each of the public access bathrooms at the Capitol.
