Narrative:

The projected costs to the state political subdivisions would be immense because most ordinary household waste is nonbiodegradable. Therefore, these wastes would have to be recycled or incinerated. If incinerated, the resulting ash from the wastes would have to be transported outside of North Dakota for disposal. The costs for incineration, transportation of ash, and recycling could be in excess of \$50 million to political subdivisions.
