Narrative:

Because the average registration fee for vehicles covered under the provisions of this bill is currently \$30.00 per year, it appears this bill would be revenue neutral during the next biennium. Vehicle owners who qualify under the provisions of this bill would pay a \$60.00 permanent registration fee instead of an annual fee of \$30.00.

It should be noted that the fiscal effect of this bill would not become apparent until the 1991-1993 biennium. Motor Vehicle Department records indicate there are 17,630 vehicles currently registered which meet the age requirements of this bill. While it cannot be determined how many of these vehicles would meet the other requirements of this bill, the department estimates there would be a revenue loss of between \$30.00 and \$450.00 for each vehicle registered under the provisions of this bill, depending on the number of years the vehicle would be operated under the special registration rate. It should also be noted that additional vehicles will become eligible for the special registration rates each year.
