Narrative:

This bill creates a state Gaming Commission. The amendments would have the Gaming Commission be responsible for issuing organization, distributor, and manufacturer licenses, promulgating administrative rules, and issuing gaming employee work permits and state gaming stamps. The duties to audit and enforce the administrative rules and gaming statutes would remain with the Attorney General. The amendments would exclude the North Dakota racing commission from the Gaming Commission.

The Gaming Commission would consist of a chairman and four other members appointed by the governor, with the consent of the senate.

The creation of a Gaming Commission will result in the incurrance of a material cost of \$383,500. This administrative and human resource cost includes one-time costs of purchases of furniture and equipment (copier, personal computers, printer, transcriber, etc.), and remodeling. Continuous costs include rent and additional staff of 3.5 full-time equivalent positions.
