Narrative:

The primary purpose of this bill is to help licensees comply with the law. A large number of licenses lapse; licensees continue to operate (i.e. retail alcoholic beverage, tobacco products, etc.) without current licenses. The regulation of this requires much office staff and law enforcement time. This translates into an unestimable amount of dollars spent on regulation. Hopefully this law change will act as an incentive to renew licenses "before" they expire and no one will need to pay reinstatement fees.

The estimated fiscal effect is based on approximately 7% non-compliance.
