The cost of student/staffing database software is based on reduced prices for either OSIRIS or THE SCHOOL SYSTEM software.

Approximately 80 school districts have accounting programs that meet specifications and others require some programming for compatibility. The school accounting software costs are based on prices for RDA Systems Microbudget and for the Software Unlimited programs which include modules for the General Ledger, Accounts Payable and Payroll.

Nationally when systems of this type are initiated the school district share varies from zero to one hundred percent. I would suggest a cost sharing arrangement where the district is responsible for thirty-five to sixty-five percent of the cost. It should be noted that training costs have not been included in the above estimated costs.

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-21-13.1 of the North Dakota
2 Century Code, relating to the establishment of a computerized education data
3 collection process.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-21-13.1 of the North Dakota Century
6 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

7 15-21-13.1. Uniform accounting and reporting system. The
8 superintendent of public instruction shall implement a uniform system for the
9 accounting, budgeting, and reporting of fiscal data for all school districts
10 in the state. The accounting system shall be based on Handbook II-B;
11 *Accounting for Local and State School Systems - 1990 (NCS, 1990)*
~~Revised~~ as developed and piloted in the state's school districts during the
12 past two years. By July 1, 1993, the superintendent of public instruction
13 shall establish a computerized education data collection process for the
14 accurate and timely receipt of education data from each public school
15 district. All school districts shall, upon request, submit additional
16 reports concerning finances, *staffing and students* to the superintendent of public instruction.
