Narrative:

House Bill 1478, if adopted, would transfer meat inspection authority from federal to state control. Those slaughter establishments requesting transfer from federal to state inspection would be considered on an earliest request basis as appropriated funding would allow.

With no previous data to determine costs of operation of a state meat inspection program, fiscal information was obtained from adjoining states with current programs in place. It is anticipated the minimal fiscal impact this program will have on the general fund budget for the 1919-93 biennium, is \$510,370. This figure is based on the assumption of a 50/50 - state/federal cost sharing of the program.

If this cost projection is too low, provision for additional funding will have to be provided. Once the state accepts meat inspection authority, requirements are mandated by federal law, and the inspection will have to be maintained regardless of the cost.


