1. Please estimate the fiscal impact (in dollar amounts) of the above measure for state general or special funds, counties, and cities.

Narrative:

One of the amendments to this bill increased the population requirement for cities permitted to prepare a report in lieu of an audit from 300 to 1,000. This amendment would exempt 81 additional cities from the requirement that they must be audited. However, some of these cities may voluntarily decide to be audited and others may be required to have an audit under federal requirements. The actual number of cities that decide or are required to have an audit cannot

Another amendment with some fiscal impact, is the requirement that our office would only review audits when federal funds are involved. Our office has discussed this change with the attorney general's office and it appears further clarification of this amendment is needed as the following paragraph (in the bill) requires that all reports be approved by our office but this amendment seems to imply we would only review audits when federal funds are received. The overall fiscal impact of this amendment on the state and cities would not be material. It has no fiscal impact on counties.
