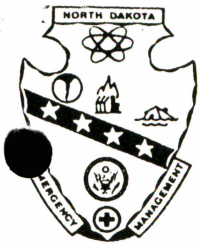

FISCAL NOTE

HB 1160

Narrative:

HB 1160 is a bill to amend two subsections of section 37-17.1-07.1. The addition of lines 21, 22, and 23 will have a fiscal impact on the "**special funds**" received by the State. State law requires that half of the funds collected must be transferred to the county hazardous chemicals preparedness and response account. Therefore, the fiscal impact to the State and the counties will be the same. Passage of HB 1160 will result in the State and its Counties losing an estimated \$30,000 per biennium. The greatest impact would be on those "counties" with a large number of oil production facilities. The largest estimated impact to any one county would be about \$4000 per biennium.
