Narrative:

This is an omnibus bill related to games of chance sponsored by the State Gaming Commission. The bill clarifies ambiguities and definitions, adds several allowable eligible uses of net proceeds, refines the classification of Class A and Class B organizations, limits a licensed organization to thirty sites, increases the monetary fine applied to manufacturers, licenses manufacturers and manufacturer's distributors of pull tab dispensing devices, and classifies as a class C felony a fraudulent scheme or technique to cheat or skim involving the game twenty-one.
