Allowing contributions to the three special funds by the North Dakota Horse Racing Foundation, will have a positive fiscal effect. However, the effect is not quantifiable until the activities of the Foundation (a non-profit organization) are defined.

If the industry grows as projected, it could outstrip the North Dakota Racing Commission's ability to fund proper regulation in a biennial interim. Thus, an Emergency Commission provision for industry funded regulation.
