Narrative: It would be impossible to accurately estimate the fiscal impact of this bill without knowing the total hours worked and wage earned by each of the approximately 4000 election workers in the last election and comparing what each would have earned under this bill. In addition, the impact of this bill depends on the choices this bill allows counties to make in relation to the number of election judges and poll clerks they employ and the training sessions they attend.
