**ATTACHMENT TO FISCAL NOTE
AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1441**

INTERSTATE BRANCHING

The amendments to Engrossed House Bill No. 1441 reduce the Department's responsibilities as contained in the bill. The amendments change the effective date of interstate branching by consolidation from May 1, 1997, to May 31, 1997. For interstate branching by consolidation, the effective date will only exist for one month of the biennium. Therefore, the additional examinations to be conducted, and the need for any additional staff and operating expenses will not take place until the 1997-99 biennium.

Because of the added responsibility to examine out-of-state branches, the Department is estimating the need for one additional FTE position. The salaries and benefits, and related operating expenses would need to be increased for the 1997-99 biennium.

INTRA-STATE BRANCHING

It is anticipated the Department will receive approximately 20 applications at \$1,500 each during the 1995-97 biennium. Since the Department is a self-supporting special fund agency, bank assessments will be reduced by the amount of any application revenue, and consequently will not result in any impact to Department net revenue. No additional examination personnel or expenses are necessary for supervision of in-state branches.
