Narrative: SB 2144 is a housekeeping bill. The Division has accepted non-resident enrollments since 1940. The revenue generated from nonresidents is included in the other funds the Division is authorized to expend. Although Section 15-19-01 of the Century Code does not disallow nonresident enrollments, the State Board of Public School Education felt it was important that this section be clarified to permit nonresidents to use Division of Independent services.
