**BILL DESCRIPTION:** Study of Employment Classifications

**BILL NO.** Amendment to SB 2387; Draft No. 50773.0101

**SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION:** The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, have reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

While the studies proposed in this bill may impact the way certain industries are classified and, as a result, allocated premium, it is not expected that the bill will have an impact on overall premium rates or current loss reserves of the Fund. As amended, the bill calls for study of selected classifications. Such studies can be conducted within the scope of current actuarial reviews. No significant fiscal impact is expected.
