Narrative on Fiscal Note

This fiscal note addresses the impact of Senate Bill No. 2388 if it is enacted as amended by the "hoghouse" amendment approved by the House Agriculture Committee. The amendment substantially revises the bill. It imposes only one substantial responsibility upon state agencies, that is, to conduct a takings assessment when agencies propose to enact a rule that limits the use of privately-owned real property.

I contacted the agencies that will likely be primarily effected by the bill. Their assessment of the fiscal impact for the biennium is as follows:

State Engineer	\$2,000
Game and Fish Dep't	\$2,000
Health Dep't	\$5,000
Dep't of Human Services	"minimal" fiscal impact
Public Service Comm'n	"minimal" fiscal impact
Dep't of Transportation	\$2,000
Parks and Recreation Dep't	0
