BILL DESCRIPTION: Experience Rating of Employers

BILL NO. SB 2403 (As amended by 58349.0201)

SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION: The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, have reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

Based on a review by the Workers Compensation Bureau and its Actuary, the changes proposed in this bill are not expected to have an impact on Workers Compensation premiums or its unpaid liability. As introduced, future changes in experience rating programs and premium rates for all groups could be made within the limitations proposed in the bill. As a result, the change could be implemented without additional administrative cost to the agency.
