- 2 14-12.2-33.4, 14-12.2-33.5, 14-12.2-46.1, and 14-12.2-46.2 of the North Dakota Century Code,

- Modification of a registered child support order is subject to the same requirements, procedures, and defenses that apply to the modification of an order issued by a tribunal of this state and the order may be enforced and satisfied in the same manner.
- 3. A tribunal of this state may not modify any aspect of a child support order that may not be modified under the law of the issuing state. If two or more tribunals have issued child support orders for the same obligor and child, the order that is controlling and must be recognized under section 14-12.2-10 establishes the nonmodifiable aspects of the support order.
- 4. On issuance of an order modifying a child support order issued in another state, a tribunal of this state becomes the tribunal of continuing, exclusive jurisdiction.
- 5. Within thirty days after issuance of a modified child support order, the party obtaining the modification shall file a certified copy of the order with the issuing

A tribunal of this state may serve as an initiating or responding tribunal in a proceeding brought under this chapter or a law <u>or procedure</u> substantially similar to this chapter, <u>or under a law or procedure substantially similar to</u> the Uniform Reciprocal Enforcement of Support Act, or the Revised Uniform Reciprocal Enforcement of Support Act to determine that the petitioner is a parent of a particular child or to determine that a respondent is a parent of that child.
 - 2. In a proceeding to determine parentage, a responding tribunal of this state shall apply section 14-12.2-28 and chapter 14-17.
 - **SECTION 17. UNIFORMITY OF APPLICATION AND CONSTRUCTION.** Chapter 14-12.2 must be applied and construed to effectuate its general purpose to make uniform the law with respect to the subject of the chapter among states enacting it.
- SECTION 18. SHORT TITLE. Chapter 14-12.2 may be cited as the Uniform Interstate
 Family Support Act.
 - **SECTION 19. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.** If any provision of chapter 14-12.2 or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of the chapter which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of the chapter are severable.
