## HOUSE BILL NO. 1352

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 50-11.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a board of early childhood services; and to amend and reenact
- 3 section 50-11.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to early childhood services.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 50-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

7 Board of early childhood services - Membership - Compensation. The board of 8 early childhood services consists of five members appointed by the governor. Three members 9 must be licensed early childhood services providers chosen from a list of six licensed providers 10 submitted to the governor by child care providers, incorporated, and two members must be lay 11 persons. Of the three licensed early childhood providers chosen, at least one must be a family 12 child care home provider and at least one must be a child care center provider. Each member 13 must be a citizen and a resident of this state. The term of office of each board member is for three years; provided, that of the members initially appointed, one provider member and one lay 14 15 member must be appointed for a term of one year; one provider member and one lay member 16 must be appointed for a term of two years; and one provider member must be appointed for a 17 term of three years. No person may serve more than two consecutive three-year terms. The 18 governor may remove any board member for good cause after giving that member a written 19 statement of the reasons for removal and after that member has had an opportunity for a 20 hearing. In the case of vacancy on the board caused by death, resignation, or removal, the 21 governor shall appoint a qualified person to serve the remainder of the unexpired term. Each 22 appointed member is entitled to be paid mileage and expenses as authorized by law for state 23 officials and employees.

3	Powers and duties of board of early childhood services. The department shall		
4	submit rules adopted under this chapter to the board of early childhood services for approval		
5	before submitting the rules to the attorney general for an opinion as to legality under section		
6	28-32-02. The board shall advise the department in the development of policies and rules		
7	governing the early childhood services authorized under this chapter including:		
8	<u>1.</u>	Ear	ly childhood facility licensing requirements.
9	<u>2.</u>	Pro	vider training and continuing education requirements.
10	<u>3.</u>	<u>Adr</u>	ninistration and recordkeeping requirements.
11	<u>4.</u>	Fac	ility safety and sanitation requirements.
12	<u>5.</u>	Mor	nitoring, evaluation, and audit requirements.
13	<u>6.</u>	Sta	ndards and requirements for the safety and health of children in early childhood

15	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 50-11.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
16	amended and reenacted as follows:		
17	50-11.1-08. Minimum standards - Rules and regulations - Inspection by a		
18	governmental unit. The Subject to section 2 of this Act, the department may:		
19	1.	Esta	ablish reasonable minimum standards for the operation of early childhood
20		faci	lities, and the registration of in-home providers. In appropriate circumstances
21		and	upon good cause shown, specific minimum standards may be substituted by
22		alternate, equivalent standards, approved by the department.	
23	2.	Tak	e such action and make such reasonable rules and regulations for the
24		regulation of early childhood services as may be necessary to carry out the	
25		pur	poses of this chapter and entitle the state to receive aid from the federal
26		government.	
27	3.	Authorize a governmental unit to:	
28		a.	Inspect any home or facility for which a license is applied for or issued under
29			this chapter; and
30		b.	Certify to the department that the home or facility meets the requirements of
31			this chapter and the minimum standards prescribed by the department.
