- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 12.1-31.1-03, 12.1-31.1-04, and subdivision a
- 2 of subsection 1 of section 19-03.1-23 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to unlawful
- 3 possession, manufacture, or delivery of drug paraphernalia and methamphetamine; to provide a
- 4 penalty; and to provide an appropriation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 12.1-31.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code 7 is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 **12.1-31.1-03. Unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia.** It shall be unlawful for
- 9 any person to use, or to possess with intent to use, drug paraphernalia to plant, propagate,
- 10 cultivate, grow, harvest, manufacture, compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test,
- analyze, pack, repack, store, contain, conceal, inject, ingest, inhale, or otherwise introduce into
- 12 the human body a controlled substance in violation of chapter 19-03.1. Any person violating
- 13 this section is guilty of a class <u>C felony if the drug paraphernalia is used, or possessed with</u>
- intent to be used, to manufacture, compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test, or
- analyze a controlled substance, other than marijuana, classified in schedule I, II, or III of
- 16 <u>chapter 19-03.1.</u> Otherwise, a violation of this section is a class A misdemeanor.
- 17 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 12.1-31.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code
- 18 is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 19 **12.1-31.1-04. Unlawful manufacture or delivery of drug paraphernalia.** It shall be
- 20 unlawful for any person to deliver, possess with intent to deliver, or manufacture with intent to
- 21 deliver, drug paraphernalia, knowing, or under circumstances where one reasonably should
- 22 know, that it will be used to plant, propagate, cultivate, grow, harvest, manufacture, compound,
- 23 convert, produce, process, prepare, test, analyze, pack, repack, store, contain, conceal, inject,
- 24 ingest, inhale, or otherwise introduce into the human body a controlled substance in violation of

- chapter 19-03.1. Any person violating this section is guilty of a class <u>C felony if the drug</u>
 paraphernalia will be used to manufacture, compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test,
 or analyze a controlled substance, other than marijuana, classified in schedule I, II, or III of
 chapter 19-03.1. Otherwise, a violation of this section is a class A misdemeanor.
 - **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Subdivision a of subsection 1 of section 19-03.1-23 of the 1995 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - a. A controlled substance classified in schedule I or II which is a narcotic drug,
 or methamphetamine, is guilty of a class A felony and must be sentenced:
 - (1) For a first offense, to imprisonment for at least a year and a day.
 - (2) For a second offense, to imprisonment for at least five years.
 - (3) For a third or subsequent offense, to imprisonment for twenty years.

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$175,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state department of health for the purpose of employing two full-time equivalent employees as forensic scientists at the state crime laboratory, and the sum of \$183,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the attorney general for the purpose of employing two full-time equivalent employees as criminal investigators at the bureau of criminal investigation, for the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999.
