- 1 A BILL for an Act relating to the appointment of a commission for the purpose of studying the
- 2 state's role in the delivery of a seamless and a uniform system of education, as referenced in
- 3 section 2 of article VIII of the Constitution of North Dakota; and to provide an expiration date.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

## SECTION 1. North Dakota education commission - Members - Compensation.

- 1. The governor shall appoint seven members to the North Dakota education commission. The members shall have a strong understanding of the interaction between public education and the economic well-being of the state. The superintendent of public instruction, the chancellor of higher education, the president of the state board of higher education, the director of vocational and technical education, and the chairman of the state board for vocational and technical education shall serve as ex officio members. The governor shall appoint one of the members to serve as chairman of the commission. The commission shall meet at the times and locations selected by the chairman.
- 2. Each member of the commission is entitled to receive the same per diem compensation as provided for members of the legislative council under section 54-35-10, and reimbursement of expenses as provided by law for state officers, while attending meetings or performing duties directed by the commission, except that no compensation under this section may be paid to any member who receives compensation or salary as a regular state employee or official.
- 3. The governor shall provide administrative, clerical, and other staff support to the commission.

## SECTION 2. North Dakota education commission - Duties - Recommendations.

1 The commission shall study the administrative consolidation of elementary, 2 secondary, vocational, and higher education in this state. The commission shall 3 address and make recommendations regarding: 4 The development and implementation of an efficient administrative structure a. 5 appropriate to the management and control of elementary, secondary, 6 vocational, and higher education in this state; 7 b. The qualifications of personnel involved in such an administrative structure, 8 including the method of selecting such personnel; 9 Elementary, secondary, vocational, and higher education delivery systems, C. 10 including those that are technologically based; and 11 d. Any other issues related to the state's role in the delivery to its citizens of a 12 seamless education system and a uniform education system, beginning with 13 the primary and extending through all grades up to and including schools of 14 higher education, as referenced in section 2 of article VIII of the Constitution 15 of North Dakota. 16 2. The commission shall report its findings and recommendations to the legislative 17 council or to a committee designated by the legislative council on or before 18 August 1, 1998. 19 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through June 30, 1999, and 20 after that date is ineffective.
