PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO REENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2232

Page 1, line 1, after "A BILL" replace the remainder of the bill with "for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 11-17-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the fees to be charged by the clerk of district court.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 11-17-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 1. The clerk of the district court shall charge and collect the following fees in civil cases:
 - a. For filing a case for decision that is not a small claims action, eighty sixty dollars.
 - (1) Ten dollars of this fee must be paid by the clerk of court to the state treasurer for deposit in the civil legal services fund.
- (2) <u>b.</u> For the filing of a petition for dissolution of marriage, annulment, or separation from bed and board, fifty eighty dollars. Fifty dollars of this fee must be paid by the clerk of court to the state treasurer for deposit in the displaced homemaker account created by section 14-06.1-14.
 - (3) For all other filings, fifty dollars of this fee must be paid by the clerk of court to the state treasurer for deposit in the state general fund.
- b. c. For filing an answer to a case that is not a small claims action, fifty dollars. The clerk shall deposit this fee with the state treasurer for deposit in the general fund in the state treasury.
- e. d. For filing a small claims action in district court, ten dollars.
- d. e. For filing any matter authorized to be filed in the office of the clerk of court other than under subdivision a, b, or c, five dollars.
- e. <u>f.</u> For preparing, certifying, issuing, or transmitting any document, five dollars; or such lesser fee as may be set by a schedule to be promulgated by the state court administrator.
- For filing a motion or an answer to a motion to modify an order for alimony, property division, child support, or child custody, thirty dollars. The clerk shall deposit this fee with the state treasurer for deposit in the general fund of the state treasury."
