- 1 A BILL for an Act relating to the allocation of research grants to agricultural commodity groups;
- 2 to amend and reenact section 57-43.1-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to tax
- 3 refunds for fuel used for agricultural purposes; and to provide an appropriation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. <u>Agricultural products utilization commission - Apportionment of</u> research funds.

- 1. The agricultural products utilization commission annually shall apportion the proceeds of the North Dakota agricultural research fund as follows:
 - a. Seventy percent to the grant committees of the North Dakota agricultural commodity groups that raise research moneys through perpetual fundraising mechanisms, provided that:
 - (1) The commodity represented accounts for at least two percent of the gross sales of all agricultural commodities grown or produced in the state;
 - (2) The percentage of the dollars available for each agricultural commodity group under this section may not exceed the percentage that the gross sales of the agricultural commodity bear to the North Dakota gross sales of all agricultural commodities grown or produced during the previous year, as determined by the agricultural statistics service; and
 - (3) The grant committee of an agricultural commodity group obtains and commits funds equal to twenty-five percent of the total amount awarded or distributed to the research project.
 - <u>b.</u> <u>Eighteen percent to the grant committee representing animal agriculture.</u>
 - c. Twelve percent to the grant committee representing new and emerging crops.

1 Any moneys not expended by a grant committee during the first year of a biennium 2 may be reallocated by the agricultural products utilization commission to the same 3 or to a different grant committee during the second year of the biennium. 4 SECTION 2. Agricultural commodity groups - Grant committees. 5 The governing body of each agricultural commodity group shall establish a 1. 6 committee to accept moneys apportioned by the agricultural products utilization 7 commission under section 1, solicit proposals for research projects related to 8 enhancing the impact of an agricultural commodity on the economy of this state, 9 and distribute or award the moneys as research grants. Each committee must 10 consist of: 11 Four individuals who are growers or producers and who are members of the 12 agricultural commodity group, appointed by the commodity group's governing 13 body; 14 The director of the North Dakota agricultural experiment station or the b. 15 director's designee; 16 An individual who has a background in agricultural research and experience C. 17 in the contemplated field of study, appointed by the director of the North 18 Dakota agricultural experiment station; and 19 An individual who is employed in the private sector and who has a d. 20 background in agricultural research, appointed by the agricultural commodity 21 group's governing body. 22 2. The governing body of the agricultural commodity group shall determine the terms 23 of office for its grant committee members and may provide for the compensation of 24 the grant committee members and expense reimbursement at the same rate and 25 in the same manner as provided for members of the commodity group's governing 26 body. 27 3. A grant committee shall select one of the committee members to serve as 28 chairman for the period determined by the commodity group's governing body. 29 SECTION 3. Animal agriculture - Establishment of grant committee. 30 A grant committee representing animal agriculture is established for the purpose of 1.

27	<u>1.</u>	A gr	ant committee representing new or emerging crops is established for the
28		pur	pose of accepting moneys apportioned by the agricultural products utilization
29		com	nmission under section 1, soliciting proposals for research projects related to
30		the	study of new or emerging crops, and distributing or awarding the moneys as
31		rese	earch grants. The committee must consist of:

1 Four individuals who are growers or producers of a new or emerging crop or a. 2 who have a familiarity with new or emerging crops, appointed by the 3 agricultural products utilization commission; 4 The director of the North Dakota agricultural experiment station or the b. 5 director's designee; 6 C. An individual who has a background in agricultural research and experience 7 in the contemplated field of study, appointed by the director of the North 8 Dakota agricultural experiment station; and 9 An individual who is employed in the private sector and who has a d. 10 background in agricultural research, appointed by the agricultural products 11 utilization commission. 12 <u>2.</u> The agricultural products utilization commission shall determine the terms of office 13 for the grant committee members and, using a portion of the moneys available for 14 award or distribution to the grant committee, may provide for the compensation of 15 the grant committee members and expense reimbursement at the same rate and 16 in the same manner as provided for members of the agricultural products utilization 17 commission. 18 The grant committee shall select one of the committee members to serve as <u>3.</u> 19 chairman for the period determined by the agricultural products utilization 20 commission. 21 **SECTION 5.** Distribution of research grants. Each grant committee shall distribute 22 or award the moneys available for research grants on a competitive basis to persons affiliated 23 with institutions of higher education or research organizations in this state or in other states for 24 the purpose of conducting research with a view to enhancing the impact of an agricultural 25 commodity on the economy of this state. An out-of-state grant recipient must provide matching 26 funds in an amount equal to the research grant and must designate a person affiliated with an 27 institution of higher education in this state or with a research organization in this state to serve 28 as a coordinator and collaborator. 29 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 57-43.1-03.1 of the 1995 Supplement to the 30 North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

57-43.1-03.1. (Effective until December 31, 1999) Refund of tax for fuel used for agricultural purposes - Reduction for agricultural fuel tax fund Reductions. Any person who buys or uses any motor vehicle fuel for agricultural purposes, except motor vehicle fuel used in motor vehicles operated or intended to be operated in whole or in part upon any of the public highways of this state on which the motor vehicle fuel tax has been paid, must be reimbursed or repaid within the time provided in this chapter, the amount of the tax paid upon the presentation to and the approval of the commissioner of a claim for refund. The amount of the tax refund provided for in this section must be reduced by four eight cents per gallon [3.79] liters] except for those fuels used in aircraft or with respect to refunds claimed by aircraft fuel users, two. Two cents per gallon [3.79 liters] withheld from the refund must be deposited in the agricultural fuel tax fund, and two cents per gallon [3.79 liters] withheld from the refund must be retained in the highway tax distribution fund, and four cents per gallon [3.79 liters] withheld from the refund must be deposited in the agricultural research fund. Those persons who have a valid tax assignment permit issued by the commissioner under section 57-43.1-11 must be charged four eight cents per gallon [3.79 liters] by the dealer and the four eight cents charged must be remitted to the commissioner by the dealer when the dealer submits the tax assigned invoices for credit.

(Effective January 1, 2000) Refund of tax for fuel used for agricultural purposes - Reduction for agricultural fuel tax fund Reductions. Any person who buys or uses any motor vehicle fuel for agricultural purposes, except motor vehicle fuel used in motor vehicles operated or intended to be operated in whole or in part upon any of the public highways of this state on which the motor vehicle fuel tax has been paid, must be reimbursed or repaid within the time provided in this chapter, the amount of the tax paid upon the presentation to and the approval of the commissioner of a claim for refund. The amount of the tax refund provided for in this section must be reduced by two six cents per gallon [3.79 liters] except for those fuels used in aircraft or with respect to refunds claimed by aircraft fuel users, two. Two cents per gallon [3.79 liters] withheld from the refund must be deposited in the agricultural fuel tax fund and four cents per gallon [3.79 liters] withheld from the fund must be deposited in the agricultural research fund. Those persons who have a valid tax assignment permit issued by the commissioner under section 57-43.1-11 must be charged two six cents per gallon [3.79

- liters] by the dealer and the two six cents charged must be remitted to the commissioner by the dealer when the dealer submits the tax assigned invoices for credit.
- SECTION 7. Agricultural research fund Creation. The agricultural research fund is
 a special fund in the state treasury. The proceeds of the fund must be expended for purposes
 of agricultural research, as provided for by sections 2 and 3 of this Act.
- SECTION 8. TRANSFER. The office of management and budget shall transfer

 \$1,000,000, or so much of the amount as is necessary, from the agricultural fuel tax fund to the

 agricultural research fund for the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999.
- SECTION 9. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the agricultural research fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$3,000,000, or so much of the fund as may be necessary, to the agricultural consultation board for the purpose of providing grants for agricultural research, for the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999.
