- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 15-40.1-06 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the educational support per student.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 15-40.1-06 of the 1995 5 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 6 2. a. The educational support per student during the first year of the 1995-97 7 1997-99 biennium must be one two thousand seven hundred fifty-seven 8 fifty-two dollars and for the second year of the 1997-99 biennium the 9 educational support per student must be ene two thousand eight two hundred 10 sixty-two forty-two dollars and is the basis for calculating grants-in-aid on a 11 per student basis as provided in sections 15-40.1-07 and 15-40.1-08. 12 The educational support per student during the first year of the 1999-2001 b. 13 biennium must be two thousand four hundred forty-four dollars and for the 14 second year of the 1999-2001 biennium the educational support per student 15 must be two thousand six hundred forty-six dollars and is the basis for 16 calculating grants-in-aid on a per student basis as provided in sections 17 15-40.1-07 and 15-40.1-08. 18 The educational support per student during the first year of the 2001-03 <u>C.</u> 19 biennium must be two thousand eight hundred sixty-one dollars and for the 20 second year of the 2001-03 biennium the educational support per student 21 must be three thousand seventy-six dollars and is the basis for calculating 22 grants-in-aid on a per student basis as provided in sections 15-40.1-07 and

15-40.1-08.

- d. School districts operating high schools not meeting the minimum curriculum as provided in section 15-41-24 or the teacher qualifications in section 15-41-25 must be supported in the amount of two hundred twenty dollars, which is the basis for calculating grants-in-aid on a per student basis as provided in section 15-40.1-07.
- c. e. School districts operating high schools that are not accredited pursuant to the accreditation standards adopted by the superintendent of public instruction on July 1, 1991, or that become unaccredited in any succeeding school year must be supported for the 1991-92 school year or for the first year that they become unaccredited in the amount of the educational support per student established in subdivision a, which is the basis for calculating grants-in-aid on a per student basis as provided in section 15-40.1-07, but those school districts are not entitled to the amounts resulting from applying the factors in that section. The amount of aid a school district is entitled to under this subsection for each high school that is not accredited must be reduced by two hundred dollars times the number of students in the school for the second school year that the high school is unaccredited, and an additional two hundred dollars per student in the unaccredited school for each additional year the school remains unaccredited. Any high school that becomes accredited is entitled to the per student payments provided for in section 15-40.1-07 for the entire school year in which the school becomes accredited.
- d. f. School districts operating elementary schools that are not accredited pursuant to the accreditation standards adopted by the superintendent of public instruction on July 1, 1992, or that become unaccredited in any succeeding school year must be supported for the 1992-93 school year or for the first year that they become unaccredited in the amount of the educational support per student established in subdivision a, which is the basis for calculating grants-in-aid on a per student basis as provided in section 15-40.1-08, except that the amount of aid that a school district is entitled to under this subsection for each elementary school that is unaccredited must be reduced by two hundred dollars times the number of students in the school each year that the

1	elementary school is unaccredited. Any elementary school that becomes
2	accredited is entitled to the per student payments provided for in section
3	15-40.1-08 for the entire school year in which the school becomes accredited
