SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4031

Introduced by

Senators Andrist, Cook, Grindberg, Nething, B. Stenehjem

- 1 A concurrent resolution for the amendment of section 2 of article V, subsection 2 of section 6 of
- 2 article VIII, and section 3 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota, relating to the
- 3 elimination of the superintendent of public instruction and the tax commissioner as
- 4 constitutionally elected officials, the nomination of candidates for the state board of higher
- 5 education, and the composition of the board of university and school lands; to provide for
- 6 application; and to provide an effective date.

7 STATEMENT OF INTENT

- 8 This amendment removes the superintendent of public instruction and the tax commissioner as
- 9 constitutionally elected officials, removes the nomination procedure for selection of members of
- 10 the state board of higher education, and designates the state auditor as a member of the board
- 11 of university and school lands. This amendment becomes effective January 1, 2000.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE HOUSE OF

REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

- That the following proposed amendments to section 2 of article V, subsection 2 of section 6 of article VIII, and section 3 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota are
- 16 agreed to and must be submitted to the qualified electors of North Dakota at the primary
- 17 election to be held in 1998, in accordance with section 16 of article IV of the Constitution of
- 18 North Dakota.

- 19 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 2 of article V of the Constitution of North Dakota 20 is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 21 **Section 2.** The qualified electors of the state at the times and places of choosing
- 22 members of the legislative assembly shall choose a governor, lieutenant governor, agriculture
- 23 commissioner, attorney general, auditor, insurance commissioner, three public service
- 24 commissioners, secretary of state, superintendent of public instruction, tax commissioner, and

treasurer. The legislative assembly may by law provide for a department of labor to be administered by a public official who may be either elected or appointed.

The powers and duties of the agriculture commissioner, attorney general, auditor, insurance commissioner, public service commissioners, secretary of state, superintendent of public instruction, tax commissioner, and treasurer must be prescribed by law. If the legislative assembly establishes a labor department, the powers and duties of the officer administering that department must be prescribed by law.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 6 of article VIII of the Constitution of North Dakota is amended and reenacted as follows:

2. a. The state board of higher education consists of eight members. The governor shall appoint seven members who are qualified electors and taxpayers of the state, and who have resided in this state for not less than five years immediately preceding their appointments. These seven appointments are subject to confirmation by the senate.

The governor shall appoint as the eighth member of the board a full-time resident student in good academic standing at an institution under the jurisdiction of the state board. Except for the student member, no more than one person holding a bachelor's degree from a particular institution under the jurisdiction of the state board of higher education may serve on the board at any one time. Except for the student member, no person employed by any institution under the control of the board shall serve as a member of the board and no employee of any such institution may be eligible for membership on the state board of higher education for a period of two years following the termination of employment.

The governor shall nominate from a list of three names for each position, selected by action of four of the following five persons: the president of the North Dakota education association, the chief justice of the supreme court, the superintendent of public instruction, the president pro tempore of the senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives and, with the consent of a majority of the members-elect of the senate, shall appoint from the list to the state board of higher education seven members. - shall ensure that the board membership is maintained in a balanced and representative manner. The term of office of members appointed to fill vacancies at the expiration of said terms shall be for four years, and in the case of vacancies otherwise arising, appointments shall be made only is for the balance of the term of the members whose places are to be filled. A member may not be appointed to serve for more than two terms. If a member is appointed to fill a vacancy and serves two or more years of that term, the member is deemed to have served one full term.
- b. In the event If any nomination made by the governor is not consented to and confirmed by the senate, the governor shall again nominate a candidate selected from a new list. The nomination shall must be submitted to the senate for confirmation and the proceedings shall must continue until an appointee has been confirmed by the senate or the session of the legislature legislative assembly has adjourned.
 - If a term expires or a vacancy occurs when the legislature legislative assembly is not in session, the governor may appoint from a list selected as provided, a member who shall serve until the opening of the next session of the legislature legislative assembly, at which time the appointment must be certified to the senate for confirmation. If the appointee is not confirmed by the thirtieth legislative day of the session, the office shall be is deemed vacant and the governor shall nominate another candidate for the office. The same proceedings shall must be followed as are set forth in this section. If the legislature legislative assembly is in session at any time within six months prior to before the date of the expiration of the term of any member, the governor shall nominate a successor from a list selected as above set forth, within the first thirty <u>legislative</u> days of the session and upon confirmation by the senate the successor shall take office at the expiration of the incumbent's term. No person who has been nominated and whose nomination the senate has failed to confirm is eligible for an interim appointment. On or before July first of each year, beginning in 1995, the governor shall appoint a student member from a list of names recommended by the executive board of the

1	North Dakota student association for a term of one year, beginning on July
2	first. A student member may not serve more than two consecutive terms.
3	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 3 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota
4	is amended and reenacted as follows:
5	Section 3. The superintendent of public instruction, governor, attorney general,
6	secretary of state, state auditor, and state treasurer comprise a board of commissioners, to be
7	denominated the "board of university and school lands". Subject to the provisions of this article
8	and any law that may be passed by the legislative assembly, the board has control of the
9	appraisement, sale, rental, and disposal of all school and university lands, and the proceeds
10	from the sale of such those lands shall must be invested as provided by law.
11	SECTION 4. APPLICATION. If approved by the voters, this measure does not affect
12	any term of office to which an officer has been elected before the effective date of this Act.
13	SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. If approved by the voters, this measure becomes
14	effective on January 1, 2000.
