## ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2014

(At the request of the Governor)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the children's
- 2 services coordinating committee; to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-56 of the
- 3 North Dakota Century Code, relating to regional and tribal children's services coordinating
- 4 committees; to amend and reenact sections 54-56-01, 54-56-03, and 54-56-04 of the North
- 5 Dakota Century Code, relating to the membership and duties of the children's services
- 6 coordinating committee; and to repeal section 54-56-05 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 7 relating to the children's services coordinating committee receiving and spending funds.

## 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the

funds as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from special funds derived from federal

11 funds and other income to the children's services coordinating committee for the purpose of

defraying the expenses of its various divisions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and

13 ending June 30, 1999, as follows:

14 Salaries and wages \$ 66,243

15 Operating expenses 97,445

17 Total all funds \$5,643,444

**SECTION 2. GRANTS.** Of the \$5,479,756 appropriated in the grants line item in

19 section 1 of this Act, the children's services coordinating committee shall provide a grant of

20 \$150,000 to the partnership project that is providing services to children with serious emotional

21 disorders in human service regions number two (Minot), five (Fargo), and seven (Bismarck)

22 during the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999. Any other statewide

23 grants distributed by the committee, unless specifically approved by the legislative assembly,

24 are subject to budget section approval.

1	SECTION 3. ADDITIONAL INCOME. All inco	me of the children's services coordinating	
2	committee in excess of the estimated income line item appropriated in section 1 of this Act is		
3	hereby appropriated to the children's services coordinate	ating committee for the biennium	
4	beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999, and	d may be spent only upon authorization	
5	of the emergency commission.		
6	SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - FUNCT	TION OF REGIONAL AND TRIBAL	
7	CHILDREN'S SERVICES COORDINATING COMMIT	<b>TEES.</b> It is the intent of the legislative	
8	assembly that each regional and tribal children's service	ces coordinating committee function as a	
9	regional planning committee to monitor and coordinate	e children's services in each region and	
10	that the regional and tribal children's services coordinate	ating committees do not directly provide	
11	services or programs.		
12	SECTION 5. CHILDREN'S PROGRAMS - AC	TION IF FEDERAL FUNDS ARE	
13	DISCONTINUED. A state agency administering a program affecting children which is		
14	anticipated to receive federal funds for the program for the 1995-97 biennium shall discontinue		
15	providing services of the program to the extent that federal funds are not available for the		
16	program for the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999, unless the		
17	legislative assembly has specifically identified funds to replace the federal funds.		
18	SECTION 6. FEDERAL FUND ALLOCATION	<b>IS.</b> Of the \$6,000,000 of federal funds	
19	estimated to be generated as a result of participating entities claiming federal administrative		
20	cost reimbursements through the department of human services, the following allocations are

- 14 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-56-01 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
- 15 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 16 **54-56-01. Children's services coordinating committee Membership.** The
- 17 children's services coordinating committee is hereby established and consists of the governor
- 18 or a designee of the governor, the attorney general or a designee of the attorney general, the
- 19 commissioner of the board of higher education or a designee of the commissioner, the
- 20 superintendent of public instruction a representative of the North Dakota association of school
- 21 administrators, a representative of juvenile courts appointed by the chief justice of the supreme
- 22 court, a health district representative appointed by the governor, the executive director of the
- 23 department of human services, the state health officer, the executive director of job service
- 24 North Dakota or a designee of the executive director, the director of the department of
- 25 corrections and rehabilitation, or a designee of the director of the department of corrections and
- 26 rehabilitation, the director of the office of management and budget, or a designee of the director
- 27 of the office of management and budget, the director of vocational and technical education, the
- 28 chairperson of the governor's committee on children and youth or that chairperson's designee,
- 29 and a representative of the Indian affairs commission, a designee of the chief justice, and a
- 30 member at large to be appointed by the governor. The governor or the governor's designee
- 31 shall act as chairperson.

1	SECTIO	N 8. AMENDMENT. Section 54-56-03 of the 1995 Supplement to the North	
2	Dakota Century	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:	
3	54-56-03. Functions.		
4	1. The	committee <del>shall</del> <u>may</u> :	
5	a.	Plan for and coordinate delivery of services to children and adolescents who	
6		are abused, neglected, emotionally disturbed, mentally ill, medically disabled,	
7		runaways, homeless, deprived, school dropouts, school-age parents,	
8		chemical or alcohol abusers, unruly, or delinquent.	
9	b.	Foster preventive strategies and early intervention to strengthen families in	
10		their capacity to parent children primary prevention ideas and strategies and	
11		present those ideas and strategies to regional or tribal children's services	
12		coordinating committees.	
13	2. The	committee may coordinate, sponsor, or oversee interagency or	
14	inte	rgovernmental projects and programs for children, or projects and programs	
15	that	require the participation of both governmental and private entities shall:	
16	<u>a.</u>	Distribute funds due to regional or tribal committees within five days of	
17		receiving the funds.	
18	<u>b.</u>	Distribute its grant funds appropriated or authorized by the legislative	
19		assembly to children's services organizations and programs, subject to	
20		specific approval by the legislative assembly or the budget section. No funds	
21		grants, gifts, or services of an organization receiving funds distributed by the	
22		committee may be used for the purposes of direct provision of contraception	
23		services, abortion, or abortion referrals to minors.	
24	SECTIO	N 9. AMENDMENT. Section 54-56-04 of the 1995 Supplement to the North	
25	Dakota Century	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:	
26	54-56-04	. Charter public corporations - Duties. The children's services coordinating	
27	committee may charter up to twelve public corporations or designate organizations to serve as		
28	regional and tribal children's services coordinating committees to implement programs for the		
29	classes of children and programs described in section 54-56-03 distribute grants received from		
30	the children's services coordinating committee. The committee shall prescribe conditions for		

the creation, continuance, and duration of those corporations or designations.

1	SEC	CTION 10. A new section to chapter 54-56 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
2	created and enacted as follows:				
3	Regional or tribal children's services coordinating committee - Functions. A				
4	regional or tribal children's services coordinating committee, if established, must be composed				
5	of community volunteers and must maintain its own records. To foster and nurture the				
6	broadest base of community support and participation, at least one-third of regional or tribal				
7	committee members must be from the private sector. A regional or tribal committee shall:				
8	<u>1.</u>	Recruit local organizations to become participating entities to claim federal			
9		administrative cost reimbursements through the department of human services.			
10	<u>2.</u>	Expend administrative funding received from the state children's services			
11		coordinating committee only for costs associated with salaries and benefits,			
12		mileage and travel, meals, conferences and workshops, contract services,			
13		telephone, office supplies, marketing, printing, postage, dues and subscriptions,			
14		and temporary room rent.			
15	<u>3.</u>	Reimburse a committee member only for expenses that are not reimbursed by the			
16		organization or entity that the member is representing on the regional or tribal			
17		committee.			
18	<u>4.</u>	Submit all claims received from its participating entities claiming federal			
19		administrative cost reimbursements to the department of human services within			
20		ninety days of the end of each calendar quarter.			
21	<u>5.</u>	Distribute twenty-five percent of the federal funds generated as a result of a			
22		participating entity claiming federal administrative cost reimbursements through the			
23		department of human services to the participating entity that generated the federal			
24		administrative cost reimbursement.			
25	<u>6.</u>	Distribute funds due to participating entities within five days of receiving the funds.			
26	A regional or tribal committee may not maintain an unobligated fund balance that exceeds				
27	7 twenty-two thousand five hundred dollars at the end of each fiscal year.
