- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 25-01-03 and 25-02-04 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the qualifications and appointment of an administrator for the state
- 3 hospital.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 25-01-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

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25-01-03. Supervising officer to appoint superintendent of institutions and
administrator of state hospital - Salaries - Removal. The supervising officer shall appoint a

superintendent for each of the institutions under its control, except for the state hospital, where
 the supervising officer shall appoint a superintendent and a medical director an administrator in

consultation with a state hospital governing body. The tenure of office of each superintendent

and administrator is two years from the date of the superintendent's appointment, and the

13 superintendent appointee must possess qualifications required by this title. Any superintendent

14 An appointee may be removed by the supervising officer for misconduct, neglect of duty,

15 incompetency, or other proper cause showing the superintendent's appointee's inability or

16 refusal properly to perform the duties of office, but a. A removal at a time other than a

termination of the superintendent's appointee's two-year tenure may be had only after an

18 opportunity is given to the person to be heard before a board consisting of the governor,

19 attorney general, and supervising officer of the institution on preferred written charges. A

20 removal when made, however, is final. The supervising officer shall fix the compensation of

21 each superintendent appointee within the limits prescribed in this title and within the

22 appropriations made by the legislative assembly for compensation.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 25-02-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

1 25-02-04. Superintendent Administrator to possess certain qualifications -2 Medical director - Employees. The superintendent administrator of the state hospital must be 3 a skilled health care administrator with professional training and experience relating to the 4 management of facilities for mentally ill and chemically dependent persons and relating to the 5 needs of the mentally ill and chemically dependent persons. A The medical director, who must 6 be a licensed physician and board-certified psychiatrist, shall appoint and employ recommend 7 appointment of all physicians and clinical staff, define their qualifications and duties, and be 8 responsible for the organization and delivery of medical and clinical services at the state 9 hospital. The state hospital governing body has final approval of all physician and clinical staff 10 appointments to the state hospital. The medical director must be appointed by the 11 administrator in consultation with the supervising officer and with the approval of the governing 12 body. If the superintendent administrator is not a licensed physician and board-certified 13 psychiatrist, the medical director, or a qualified designee of the medical director, shall act as the 14 superintendent's administrator's designee in all matters in which the superintendent's 15 administrator's opinion on medical or clinical treatment is required by law. Every physician on 16 the professional staff must have a license issued by the state board of medical examiners. The 17 superintendent shall employ such other personnel as may be necessary and shall define their 18 qualifications and duties.
