## HOUSE BILL NO. 1307

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 40-13 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to removal of appointive city officers; to amend and reenact sections
- 3 40-13-09, 40-14-04, and 40-15-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to appointive city
- 4 officers; and to repeal sections 40-14-05, 40-15-06, and 40-15-07 of the North Dakota Century
- 5 Code, relating to terms and removal of appointive city officers.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 40-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 9 Appointive officers Removal upon hearing Suspension Appointment and
- 10 **removal of temporary officer.** Any person appointed to any city office and any employee of
- 11 the city may be removed by a majority vote of all of the members of the city governing body, but
- 12 an officer or employee may not be removed except for cause and unless charges are filed
- 13 against the officer or employee and the officer or employee is given an opportunity to be heard.
- 14 Within ten days after charges are filed in the office of the city auditor against any officer or
- 15 employee, the city governing body shall hear and determine the case upon its merits. The
- 16 mayor, the president of the board of city commissioners, or the city governing body, by a
- 17 majority vote of its members, may suspend any officer or employee against whom charges
- 18 have been filed until the disposition of the charges. The mayor or president of the board of city
- 19 commissioners may appoint a person to fill any vacancy temporarily until the disposition of the
- 20 charges against the incumbent. Any person appointed without confirmation by the city
- 21 governing body may be removed when it is determined to be in the best interests of the city by
- 22 the mayor or president of the board of city commissioners.
- 23 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 40-13-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 24 amended and reenacted as follows:

4	SECTION	3. AMENDMENT. Section 40-14-04 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
5	Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:	
6	40-14-04	. Appointive officers in council cities - Appointment of more than one
7	assessor Right to dispense with offices.	
8	1. The	mayor, with the approval of the city council, shall appoint the following officers
9	whe	n necessary to fill a vacancy:
10	a.	A city auditor;
11	b.	A city assessor;
12	C.	A city attorney;
13	d.	A city engineer; and
14	e.	$\underline{\text{Such other}}\ \underline{\text{Other}}$ officers as the city council deems necessary and expedient.
15	2. <del>The</del>	city assessor shall be appointed at the first meeting of the city council in
16	<del>Sep</del>	tember of each odd-numbered year. If the city council of a city containing five
17	thou	sand or more inhabitants shall declare, by resolution, that it is necessary to
18	app	oint more than one assessor, the mayor, with the approval of the council, may
19	app	oint one or two additional city assessors.
20	<del>3.</del> The	city council, including a city council under the modern council form of
21	gove	ernment, by a majority vote of all of the members may dispense with any
22	app	ointive office and provide that the duties of that office be performed through
23	cont	tract or by other officers.
24	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 40-15-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
25	amended and reenacted as follows:	
26	40-15-05. Appointive officers in commission cities - Right to dispense with	
27	offices. At the first meeting after the qualification of its members, or as soon thereafter as	
28	<del>possible, the</del> The board of city commissioners shall appoint the following officers when	
29	necessary to fill a vacancy:	
30	1. A tre	easurer;
31	2. An a	auditor:

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- 1 3. An attorney;
- 2 4. One or more assessors;
- 3 5. A city health officer who shall must be a physician;
- 4 6. A street commissioner;
- 5 7. A chief of the fire department;
- 6 8. A chief of police;
- 7 9. One or more policemen police officers;
- 8 10. A city engineer;
- 9 11. A board of public works; and
- 10
  12. Such other Other officers or boards as the board of city commissioners may deem
  11 necessary.
- 12 The board of city commissioners by a majority vote of all the members may dispense with any
- 13 appointive office and provide that the duties thereof of the office shall be performed through
- 14 <u>contract</u>, by other officers or boards, by the board of city commissioners, or by a committee or
- 15 committees thereof.
- 16 **SECTION 5. REPEAL.** Section 40-15-07 of the North Dakota Century Code and
- 17 sections 40-14-05 and 40-15-06 of the 1995 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code are
- 18 repealed.
